Notices of Motion

60 The Minister for Police, Fire and Emergency Management to move—That the House:—

- (1) Notes that Tasmania's Control Rooms are often the first point of contact for Tasmanians who call Triple Zero in need of Tasmania's emergency services.
- (2) Recognises that International Control Room Week was 24 30 October 2022 in recognition of the life-saving and life-changing roles those who work in our control centres across the Tasmanian emergency sector provide.
- (3) Further notes:—
 - (*a*) that during the recent flood events in the north and north-west of Tasmania, the State Emergency Service received over 667 calls to their central hotline to provide assistance to Tasmanians in need.
 - (b) the significant benefit of the Tasmanian Government's \$6.5 million investment into the new State Operations Centre, which is available during emergency events for emergency services to respond to disasters and critical incidents.
- (4) Congratulates all emergency service workers for the role they play in keeping Tasmanians safe. (27 October 2022)
- 61 Ms *Dow* to move—That the House:—
 - (1) Notes that:—
 - (*a*) access to mental health services in Tasmania is worsening under the Liberal Government, with alarming statistics from the Australian Medical Association (AMA) showing the extent of the crisis;
 - (b) Tasmania has seen the biggest reduction in mental health beds in public hospitals in the entire country;
 - (c) Tasmania has the longest emergency department stay time for mental health patients in the country;
 - (d) one in ten people who presented to the Emergency Department (ED) with a mental health condition waited nearly 22 hours to be seen an increase of more than 50% in just the last four years; and
 - (e) among those patients who were subsequently admitted, one in ten waited more than 28 and a half hours in ED.
 - (2) Further notes:—
 - (a) mental health workforce shortages, driven by poor conditions and wages, are also contributing to the crisis across mental health services; and
 - (b) the Liberals have made big promises when it comes to better mental health services including 27 new beds in the South, upgrading the Launceston General Hospital (LGH) and redeveloping the Spencer Clinic at the North West Regional Hospital, but to date very little has been funded or delivered.

- (3) Calls on the Government to get its priorities right and address the mental health crisis by funding and delivering more mental health beds across Tasmania instead of focusing on building a \$750 million stadium in Hobart. (8 November 2022)
- 62 Ms *White* to move—That the House:—
 - (1) Notes that:—
 - (a) public sector workers deliver critical services relied on by Tasmanians every day; and
 - (b) inflation in Tasmania is increasing at 8.6%.
 - (2) Recognises that public sector workers across Tasmania are taking industrial action as a last resort due to unsustainable working conditions.
 - (3) Agrees that:—
 - (*a*) a wage increase that does not increase at the same rate as inflation is a wage cut in real terms;
 - (b) recruitment and retention of public sector workers is critical in being able to deliver public services needed by Tasmanians; and
 - (c) paying a comparably lower wage to other states and territories impacts negatively on recruitment and retention of public sector workers, and in turn, delivery of services in Tasmania.
 - (4) Calls on the Premier, Hon Jeremy Rockliff, MP to recognise the real value of public sector workers to Tasmania, and to treat them with the respect they deserve in wage negotiations. (8 November 2022)
