## **Notices of Motion**

- 17 The Minister for Veterans' Affairs to move—That the House:—
  - (1) Notes that the Boer War Day was commemorated in Launceston on 20 June 2021.
  - (2) Further notes that the Boer War was the first conflict in which Australia fought as a nation and the first in which Australians fought alongside New Zealanders.
  - (3) Acknowledges that Boer War Day is held on or around 31 May, the anniversary of the signing of the Treaty of Vereeniging that ended the Boer War in 1902.
  - (4) Further notes that around 16,000 Australians were sent to South Africa including a group of Tasmanians referred to as a 'Tasmanian' contingent.
  - (5) Further notes that six Australians who served in the Boer War were awarded the Victoria Cross, including two Tasmanians, John Hutton Bisdee and Guy Wylly.
  - (6) Understands that Hobart was the first major centre in Australia to hold a Boer War Commemorative Day, which now occurs in cities across the country.
  - (7) Congratulates and thanks Reg Watson OAM, Tasmanian historian and author, and Dr Frank Madill, for their efforts over the years in drawing attention to the Boer War and Australia's contribution to it and ensuring that these servicemen and women are remembered. ((30 June 2021)
- **18** The Minister for Resources to move—That the House:—
  - (1) Notes that the mining and minerals processing sector, in the 12 months to the end of February 2020, employed more than 5,100 people and produces over 50 percent of the State's mercantile export value—more than \$2.8 billion in the 2019-20 year.
  - (2) Further notes that the sector also contributes millions in royalties and other payments—over \$31m in 2019/20—which go to support the provision of essential services in Tasmania.
  - (3) Recognises the importance of the sector to the Tasmanian economy and community seen in the Government's commitment of over \$3.5 million in new support to the sector including:—
    - (a) \$1.5 million to extend our co-funded Exploration Drilling Grant Initiative (EDGI) to 2025;
    - (b) \$2 million towards a new Geoscience Initiative, which will be supplemented by up to \$3 million by the Australian Government; and
    - (c) \$150,000 to TMEC to establish a Diversity Action Plan for the sector.
  - (3) Supports further growth in the sector including the future-proofing of the Rosebery Mine, subject to the appropriate assessment and approvals process, which will help secure around 500 direct jobs, many of which are in regional Tasmania.
