

REPORT for 1884.

As it has been represented to the Committee that inconvenience arises from the Accounts of this Institution being closed for the year ending 30th June, it has been arranged that for the future the Accounts shall be closed on the 31st December, which will be in accordance with the financial year observed by kindred Institutions.

The work of the Institution during the past 12 months has gone on quietly and steadily.

The average number of inmates for the year has been 12. The behaviour, on the whole, has been good. Four girls were received, and three left—all to good situations in the country, the usual outfit being provided for them on leaving.

The system of rewards in money for good conduct works well, most of the girls placing part of their money in the Savings Bank.

The girls are employed in washing, housework, cooking, needlework, and receive instruction in reading and writing.

The sum earned for the Institution by washing amounted to £275 6s. 2d.
