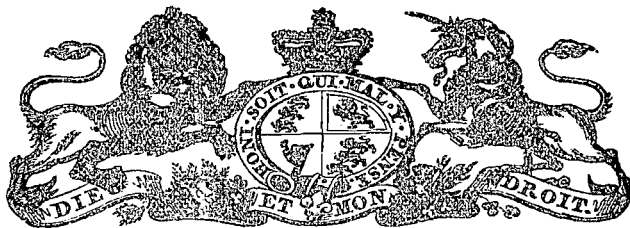

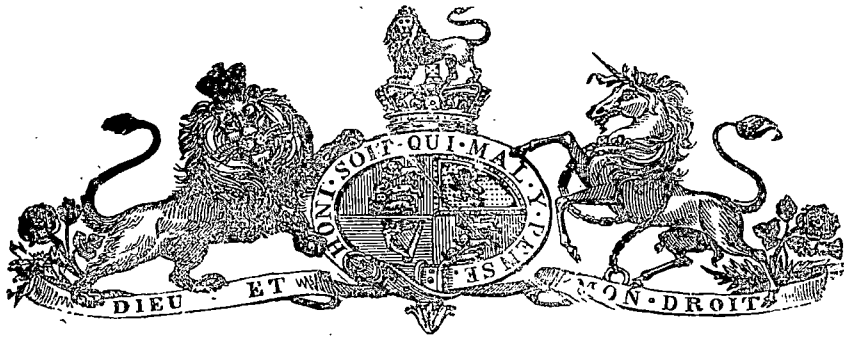

*REPORT of the CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL, 1884.*

*Campbell Town, 15th January, 1885.*

SIR,

WE have the honor to forward the Annual Report of the Campbell Town Hospital for 1884.

The finances continue in a very satisfactory condition, the Balance Sheet for 1884 showing over £500 to the good, and thus placing the Trustees in a position to apply at once for the Government Grant-in-aid, or contribution for additions to the Hospital, of £500, which was agreed to in the House of Assembly on 29th October last,—the condition being that an equal sum should be locally collected.

2. It has been found difficult to reconcile the conflicting interests of the local churches so as to admit of "Hospital Sunday" being held on any one particular Sunday in the year. It would appear desirable that the date should be fixed by "Resolution" of the Trustees, and copies of the same sent to the clergy for their information and concurrence.

3. The late Mr. Crow having devised the sum of £25 to the Hospital by will, the Hon. Treasurer has duly received the money; and the thanks of the Trustees are due to Mr. James Gray, the executor, for the handsome bequest, and his promptness in paying it.

4. The average number of patients has been maintained during the year,—viz., 59, of which 3 have died.

5. Dr. Naylor's services have been very valuable—the large sum received from Patients must be attributed to his exertions.
