



The following possible reductions were also suggested by the Engineer-in-Chief:	
Omission of the six strong-rooms (not in preliminary plans first submitted)	£
and the covered corridors connecting the old and new buildings	1500
Omission of decorative work of all kinds and under all trades, say	3000
Substitution of rubble masonry squared and dressed on face for solid ashlar in walls, say	2500
Substitution of Tasmanian freestone for Melbourne bluestone in landings, passages, staircase, &c., as the price asked for this, dressed in Melbourne,	
is very high indeed	1000

But, with the exception of the last item, the Engineer-in-Chief did not advise these reductions being made in such an important and representative building.

THE following suggestions were also made by the Engineer-in-Chief:-

Without omitting the decorative work under all trades, and without lowering the standard of the high class of masonry provided for (which is not advisable in Public Buildings of the importance of those in question), the following deductions might be made, if desired by Parliament; namely,—

Not in original plan or estimate.

A Contract has been entered into for this work, in which it is provided that the Minister or the Engineer-in-Chief for the time being shall be at liberty at any time, by notice in writing, to cause any alterations or reductions to be made by the Contractors in any part or parts of the works specified in the said plans and specification, and that the sum or sums to be deducted by the Minister from the said sum of £25,742 in respect of any such alteration or reduction or reductions shall be referred to the award, order, arbitrament, determination of three Arbitrators, of whom one shall be appointed by the Minister, another by the Contractors, and a third to be nominated and appointed by the other two Arbitrators by a Memorandum under their hands, before they proceed on the said arbitration, and the award, in writing, made by all or any two of such Arbitrators shall be binding on all parties, the Minister and the said Contractors, and their and each of their Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, and shall be absolutely conclusive.
