



POST AND TELEGRAPH DEPARTMENT.

General Post Office, Hobart, 30th April, 1900.

STR.

I have the honour to place before you a Report on the Post and Telegraph Department of Tasmania for the year 1899, showing its receipts and expenditure and the general working of its several branches. I am pleased to say that the receipts for 1899 exceed those of the previous year by £7604 1s. $6\frac{1}{2}d$. For the purposes of comparison the figures for 1898 are shown in brackets.

Revenue.—The amount collected under this head was £100,271 8s. 11d. [£92,667 7s. $4\frac{1}{2}d$], thus apportioned:—Postage, £63,714 7s. [£57,975 8s. 9d.]; revenue stamps, £8000; money order commission, £3532 9s. 7d. [£3365 19s. 6d.]; profit earned under item Savings Banks, £1333 1s. 3d. [£1249 14s. 2d.]; private boxes, mail bags, fines, &c., £1073 12s. [£875 9s. 6d.]; poundage on postal notes, £401 4s. 4d. [£359 15s. $6\frac{1}{2}d$.]; telegraph receipts, £17,932 1s. 11d. [£17,002 12s. 5d.]; telephone rentals, £4284 12s. 10d. [£3838 7s. 6d.]

The number of stamps sold were:—Adhesive, 8,567,584; post cards, 295,632; embossed envelopes, 19,572; registration envelopes, 2508; letter cards, 8244; and value of impressed, £15,318 11s. 11d.; 7914 exchanges were made, representing £228 2s. 2d. This latter amount did not enhance the revenue.

The above shows an increase in the aggregate of stamps, post cards, letter cards, and embossed and registration envelopes of 736,204.

The expenditure amounted to £78,094 19s. 11d. [£73,248 8s. 10d.], made up of salaries and allowances, £38,662 13s. 7d. [£34,830 14s. 10d.]; conveyance of mails, £27,302 8s. [£26,291 15s. 5d.]; miscellaneous, £4657 0s. 9d. [£4045 9s. 3d.]; cable subsidies, £2026 19s. 7d. [£2060 12s. 9d.]; additions, repairs, and maintenance of lines, £5445 18s. [£6019 16s. 7d.].

Parcels Post.—11,640 inland parcels were posted during the year 1899, an increase of 1839 over 1898, and 2845 ship parcels were posted, an increase of 514 over 1898.

There was also collected £3077 0s. 6d. on account of Customs dues on 15,665 packets and parcels, valued at £19,666 2s. 6d., which were received from the United Kingdom and Colonies, which amount went to credit of Customs Department.

Mail Matter.—Under this head 5,535,325 [5,126,612] inland letters were despatched, an increase of 408,713 on previous year; 4,212,730 [3,988,243] ship letters received and despatched, an increase of 224,487; 288,558 [281,944] post cards; 1,811,344 [1,477,871] packets were dealt with; and it is estimated that 6,293,018 [5,574,850] newspapers passed through the office. Of these letters and packets 1,376,317 [1,146,598] were franked, and consequently did not contribute to the revenue.

The method of counting letters for two months only of the year for statistical purposes was adopted with respect to Intercolonial and Foreign correspondence in 1898, and was brought into effect with respect to Inland correspondence during 1899. This is found to considerably reduce the work of our Country Postmasters and Staff Officials, and conduces to the more efficient working of the Department.

Dead Letter Branch.—58,291 [56,147] unclaimed letters (752 registered) were disposed of, inclusive of some 1700 [1500] "special request."

Post Offices opened during 1899.—Twelve.

Post Offices closed .- One.

Number of Miles of Post Roads at end of year, 2775 [2667], and 1,486,139 [1,407,351] miles were travelled during the year.

Inland Mail Service.—Very satisfactorily carried out, contractors giving little or no trouble to the Department.

Intercolonial Mail Service .- The contract, which has been extended for three years, is being very satisfactorily performed by the Union Steamship Company.

Moncy Orders.—During the year 130,554 [121,738] orders for £265,967 13s. 2d. [£244,971 9s. 11d.] were issued; 233,203 [228,121] for £330,094 6s. 9d. [£330,288 16s. 9d.] were paid. The commission collected on issues was £3216 13s. [£2949 16s. 3d.]

Post Office Savings Banks.—£179,608 8s. 10d. [£134,308 6s. 5d.] was received as deposit during the year, including £5924 1s. 7d. [£4698 17s. 2d.] apportioned to the depositors as interest; £124,135 7s. 3d. [£103,080 3s. 3d.] was withdrawn, leaving a balance of £248,375 12s. 10d. [£186,978 9s. 8d.] to credit of investors; 5804 accounts were opened, 3701 were closed, and 12,710 remained open at close of year, as against 10,607 in 1898.

Postal Notes.—56,114 [50,353] were sold, aggregating £16,883 11s. 6d. [£15,530 8s. 5d.] in amount, and 52,711 [48,521] were paid, aggregating £16,357 3s. 6d. [£15,311 10s. 7d.] in amount.

Much disappointment has been expressed at the delay in completion of the set of stamps bearing views of Tasmanian scenery, which were ordered in the early part of last year. values received are as follow:-

 $\frac{1}{2}d$., green, bearing view of Lake Marion; 1 d., red, , , Mount Wellin Mount Wellington; 2d., purple, 5d., blue, 6d., claret, Hobart; Mt. Gould, Lake St. Clair; ,, Dilston Falls.

The other three values (2½d., 3d., and 4d.) are daily expected.

Although the views have not been placed exactly as the Department desired, they are considered a very fine set, and have been much admired by persons competent to judge.

Letter-cards, bearing a 2d. stamp, and with various views of Tasmanian scenery, have been issued, and are finding a ready sale.
