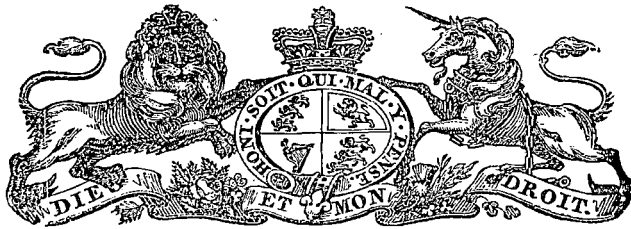

ANNUAL REPORT, 1896.

To His Excellency the Right Honourable JENICO WILLIAM JOSEPH, VISCOUNT GORMANSTON, G.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

THE Council of the University of Tasmania, in conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian University Act," has the honour to report, for the information of Your Excellency in Council, the proceedings of the University for the year 1896.

I.—PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS.

Junior Public Examination.

The Sixth Examination under the Regulations for the Junior Public Examination was held at Hobart and Launceston, and also at Ulverstone as a Local Centre for the North West Coast under a Local Committee. The Examination lasted from the 30th November to the 5th December, both dates inclusive, and was under the following Examiners:—Professor W. H. Williams, M.A.; Professor A. M'Aulay, M.A.; Messrs. A. W. Garrett, B.A.; R. E. Macnaghten, B.A.; A. B. Howell, and W. H. Jones.

Sixty-three candidates presented themselves, of whom twenty-eight were girls. Fifty-one passed; eight being placed in the First Class, and forty-three in the Second.

Junior Exhibitions.

On the result of the foregoing Examination, the Council awarded to the five following candidates Junior Exhibitions of the value of £20 per annum each, tenable for three years from the 1st January, 1897, at the Institutions mentioned after their names:—

Senior Public Examination.

The Sixth Examination under the Regulations for the Senior Public Examination began at Hobart, Launceston, and Ulverstone on the 26th November, and ended on the 4th December.

The Examiners were:—Professors W. H. Williams, M.A.; A. M'Aulay, M.A.; W. J. Brown, LL.D.; Orme Masson, D. Sc. (Melb.); Messrs. A. W. Garrett, B.A.; R. E. Macnaghten, B.A.; A. B. Howell, and W. H. Twelvetees.

Twenty candidates presented themselves, of whom seventeen satisfied the Examiners. Of these, six were placed in the First Class, five in the Second, and six in the Third. Two also who passed this Examination in 1895 entered for single subjects in order to qualify for Matriculation Certificates, and satisfied the Examiners.

On the recommendation of the Board of Examiners, prizes were awarded to the following candidates in the subjects specified:—

E. L. Piesse—English, Latin, French, History, and Geography.

T. C. Brammall—Greek.

W. F. D. Butler—Arithmetic, Algebra, and Geometry.

H. A. Ansell—Trigonometry.

The Sir Richard Dry prize for Modern Languages, including English, was awarded to Edmund Leolin Piesse.

University Scholarships.

On the Report of the Board of Examiners for the Senior Public Examination, two University Scholarships, each of the value of £50 per annum, tenable for three years from the 1st January, 1897, were awarded as follows:—

One to Thomas Colin Brammall, for the best examination in the subjects of Groups I. and II.—Languages, English History, and Geography; and one to William Frederick Dennis Butler, for the best examination in the subjects of Groups III. and IV.—Mathematics and Science.

Class Lists.

Class Lists of the Senior and Junior Public Examinations are appended to this Report.

The total number of candidates examined was 83.

II.—EXAMINATIONS FOR DEGREES.

Third or Final Honours Examination.

On the 11th, 12th, 13th, and 16th days of March a Third or Final Honours Examination in Group A. was held, at which two candidates presented themselves, and satisfied the Examiners—Professor Bensly (Adelaide) and Professor Williams. The candidates were placed as follows:—

Ordinary Examinations.

On the 5th, 6th, 10th, 11th, 12th, and 13th November there were held the Ordinary Examinations for the Degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science, and for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws. The Examiners were the Professors of

the University, with the following coadjutors for the B.A. and B.Sc. subjects :—Professors H. Laurie, LL.D. (Melbourne); M. W. MacCallum, M.A. (Sydney); and Mr. E. J. Trechmann, M.A. (Sydney); and for the Law subjects, Professor W. H. Moore (Melbourne); the Hon. N. E. Lewis, M.A., B.C.L.; Mr. F. Lodge, B.A.

For the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science Examinations there were in all 14 candidates—5 from Hobart, 9 from Launceston and other districts; of these 11 passed their several Examinations. Two more also, who had each failed to satisfy the Examiners in one subject only, subsequently passed therein at a supplementary examination held under the Regulations providing for the same, thus successfully completing the year's examination.

For the Bachelor of Laws Examinations 8 candidates entered from Hobart and 4 from Launceston; of these 9 satisfied the Examiners.

Twenty-six candidates in all presented themselves for the Degree Examinations. The names of the candidates who passed, and the classes in which Honour candidates were placed, are set forth in the class lists annexed to the Report.

Two candidates (both women) also entered under the new Regulations for admission to Examination in single subjects; one of them satisfied the Examiners.

IV.—DEGREES CONFERRED.

On Commemoration Day, 19th December, the Annual Meeting of the University was held in the Town Hall, when addresses were delivered by Your Excellency as Visitor, and by the Chancellor, Sir Lambert Dobson. Degrees were conferred on the following candidates, the first two of whom completed their qualifications for the Degree at the Honours Examination in March, 1896, and the others at the Ordinary Examination in December, 1896. It is worthy of remark that the third candidate, who was the first of her sex to obtain a Degree, was a resident of Launceston, and had, like the first graduate of this University, been enabled to qualify for the Degree by reading under the direction of the Professors, and attending at their lectures at Launceston :—

V.—LECTURES DELIVERED AT THE UNIVERSITY.

The number of Lectures delivered at the University throughout the Academic year has been the same as in previous years, averaging 40 in each week. The number of Students attending under the University Professors and Instructors at Hobart and Launceston was, in the last term, 35.

VI.—TEACHING AT LAUNCESTON.

The University Lecturers have continued to pay weekly visits to Launceston to deliver lectures and give students assistance and direction in their several courses of study. Additional teaching was given during the year by Mr. H. C. Kingsmill, M.A., and Mr. A. W. B. Perceval, B.A., who were first appointed last year, the former to give instruction in Mathematics weekly, under the Lecturer in that subject, and the latter in Modern Languages, also weekly. The number of students at Launceston was, in the last term, nineteen.

VII.—EXTENSION LECTURES.

A course of Extension Lectures, at which there was an average attendance of 40, was given during the year at Hobart by Professor Jethro Brown, M.A., LL.D., on the following subject :—"The Evolution of Federalism."

VIII.—THE COUNCIL.

His Honor Sir W. Lambert Dobson, K.C.M.G., was, on the expiration of the term of his office as Chancellor, unanimously re-elected thereto for a further term of three years from the 19th October, 1896.

The Rev. George Clarke, who has held the office of Vice-Chancellor since the inauguration of the University, was, on the 21st January, unanimously re-elected for the year.

Council Elections.

Mr. A. Montgomery, Government Geologist at Launceston, was on the 24th January, elected by the Senate in the place of Dr. E. O. Giblin, deceased. Mr. Montgomery resigned his seat at the end of the year, on leaving the Colony for an appointment in New Zealand.

Six of the seven Members retiring in accordance with the provisions of the Act were re-elected on the following dates, viz. :—

On the 26th October, the Hons. Adye Douglas, B. S. Bird, and N. J. Brown, by the Houses of Parliament.

On the 23rd November, Bishop Montgomery, D.D., Archdeacon Whittington, LL.B., and the Rev. George Clarke, by the Senate.

Mr. J. Rule, Director of Education, was elected by the Houses of Parliament in the place of the Rev. Geo. Clarke, elected by the Senate.

X. THE FACULTIES.

At the first Annual Meeting of the year, the Council elected by ballot for each Faculty Four Members of Council to serve with the *ex officio* Members of the Faculty, and the Faculties as thus constituted for the year held the following number of meetings respectively:—Faculty of Letters, 3; Faculty of Science, 2; Faculty of Law, 3.

XI. COMMITTEES.

At the February Meeting of Council, the following were re-elected as Members of the Finance Committee:—The Hon. Adye Douglas (Chairman), the Vice-Chancellor, the Hon. N. J. Brown, the Hon. N. E. Lewis, Mr. J. B. Walker.

At the same Meeting the following were also re-elected as Members of the House and Grounds Committee:—Hon. N. J. Brown (Chairman), Hon. W. Moore, Rev. J. Scott, Rev. T. Kelsh, Mr. T. Stephens, Mr. J. B. Walker.

XII. THE SENATE.

The number of meetings held by the Senate was three, and the measures approved appear below under the heading "Statutes and Regulations."

The Rev. R. D. Poulett-Harris, M.A., having been, for the sixth time, elected Warden, resigned his office at the end of the year, and the Ven. Archdeacon Hales, B.A., of Launceston, was unanimously elected to succeed him.

Mr. Poulett-Harris was for many years Rector of the High School, and not a few of the most prominent and useful citizens of our chief city were trained under his care. The scheme of the Council of Education was largely of his devising, and, in the circumstances of the colony, it was commended in all quarters by the older institutions as a wise and effective arrangement. The Council, in mentioning his resignation, desires also to record its sense of the eminent services which Mr. Poulett-Harris has rendered to the cause of education in Tasmania.

XIII. STATUTES AND REGULATIONS.

XIV. PARLIAMENTARY APPROPRIATION.

The sum of £4000, fixed by the Tasmanian University Act for payment out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Council of the University, was reduced by special legislation to £2500 for the year 1896, and also for 1897. It is earnestly hoped that the improved financial outlook of the Colony will enable Parliament to vote the sum fixed by law with a reduction not exceeding £1000 for 1898, and thus enable more teaching to be given both at Hobart and Launceston, which is desired, but cannot now be undertaken for want of funds.

XV.—ACCOUNTS.

The audited Account of Income and Expenditure, required by the provisions of "The Tasmanian University Act," is hereto appended.
