



ANNUAL REPORT, 1897.

To His Excellency the Right Honourable JENICO WILLIAM JOSEPH, VISCOUNT GORMANSTON, G.C.M.G., Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

THE Council of the University of Tasmania, in conformity with the provisions of "The Tasmanian University Act," has the honour to report, for the information of Your Excellency in Council, the proceedings of the University for the year 1897.

I.—PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS.

Junior Public Examination.

The Seventh Examination under the Regulations for the Junior Public Examination was held at Hobart and Launceston, and also at Ulverstone and Longford, as Local Centres, under Local Committees. The Examination lasted from the 29th November to the 4th December, both dates inclusive, and was under the following Examiners:—Professor A. M'Aulay, M.A.; Messrs. C. J. H. Chepmell, M.A.; R. E. Macnaghten, B.A.; F. M. Young, B.A.; S. M'Burney, Mus. Doc.; C. Naverne, and W. H. Jones.

One hundred and six candidates presented themselves. Ninety-two passed; twenty-four being placed in the First Class, and sixty-eight in the Second.

Four also entered for single subjects under the Regulations providing for the same.

Junior Exhibitions.

On the result of the foregoing Examination, the Council awarded to the five following candidates Junior Exhibitions of the value of £20 per annum each, tenable for three years from the 1st January, 1898, at the Institutions mentioned after their names:—

Senior Public Examination.

The Seventh Examination under the Regulations for the Senior Public Examination began at Hobart and Launceston on the 25th November, and ended on the 3rd December.

The Examiners were:—Professors W. H. Williams, M.A.; A. M'Aulay, M.A.; W. J. Brown, LL.D.; Orme Masson, D. Sc. (Melb.); Messrs. H. C. Kingsmill, M.A.; F. M. Young, B.A.; A. W. Garrett, B.A.; R. E. Macnaghten, B.A.; C. Naverne, W. H. Twelvetrees, and W. H. Jones.

Forty-seven candidates presented themselves, of whom thirty-nine satisfied the Examiners. Of these, twelve were placed in the First Class, thirteen in the Second, and fourteen in the Third. Two who had previously passed the Examination entered for History in order to qualify for Matriculation Certificates, and satisfied the Examiners. Five also entered for single subjects under the Regulations providing for the same.

On the recommendation of the Board of Examiners, prizes were awarded to the following candidates in the subjects specified:—

For the Sir Richard Dry prize for Modern Languages, including English, there were for the first time two at the head of the list equal to one another, namely—

University Scholarships.

On the Report of the Board of Examiners for the Senior Public Examination, two University Scholarships, each of the value of £50 per annum, tenable for three years from the 1st January, 1898, were awarded as follows:—

One for the best examination in the subjects of Groups I. and II.—Languages, English History, and Geography, to Morrison, Leonard Neil } *æq.*; and one to Edmund Leolin Norris, Edith Kate }
 Piesse, for the best examination in the subjects of Groups III. and IV.—Mathematics and Science.

Class Lists.

Class Lists of the Senior and Junior Public Examinations are appended to this Report.

The total number of candidates examined, exclusive of the 9 who entered for single subjects, and of the 2 who had previously passed the Examination and entered to complete their qualification for Matriculation, was 153.

II.—EXAMINATIONS FOR DEGREES.

Ordinary Examinations.

On the 11th, 12th, 15th, 16th, 17th, and 18th November there were held the Ordinary Examinations for the Degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Science, and for the Degree of Bachelor of Laws. The Examiners were the Professors of the University, with the following coadjutors for the B.A. and B.Sc. subjects:—Professors E. J. Nanson, M.A. (Melbourne); Orme Masson, D.Sc. (Melbourne); M. W. MacCallum, M.A. (Sydney); and for the Law subjects, Professor W. H. Moore (Melbourne); the Hon. A. I. Clark; Hon. N. E. Lewis, M.A., B.C.L.; Mr. F. Lodge, B.A.

For the Bachelor of Arts Examinations there were in all 15 candidates—6 from Hobart, 9 from Launceston; of these 13 passed their several Examinations. For the Bachelor of Science First Examination 1 candidate from Hobart, who passed, and for the Third Examination there were 2 candidates from Hobart, of whom 1 passed.

For the Bachelor of Laws Examinations 4 candidates entered from Hobart and 3 from Launceston, all of whom satisfied the Examiners.

Twenty-five candidates in all presented themselves for the Degree Examinations. The names of the candidates who passed, and the classes in which Honour candidates were placed, are set forth in the class lists annexed to the Report.

One candidate also entered under the Regulations for admission to Examination in single subjects, and satisfied the Examiners.

III.—MATRICULATED STUDENTS.

V.—LECTURES DELIVERED AT THE UNIVERSITY.

During the Third Term, Lectures were given in Modern Languages at Hobart by Monsieur Naverne.

The number of Lectures delivered at the University throughout the Academic year averaged 50 in each week. The number of Students attending under the University Professors and Instructors at Hobart and Launceston was, in the last term, 39.

VI.—TEACHING AT LAUNCESTON.

The University Lecturers have continued to pay weekly visits to Launceston to deliver lectures and give students assistance and direction in their several courses of study. Additional teaching was given during the year by Mr. H. C. Kingsmill, M.A., and Mr. A. W. B. Perceval, B.A., who were appointed in 1895, the former to give instruction in Mathematics weekly, under the Lecturer in that subject, and the latter in Modern Languages, also weekly. The number of students at Launceston was, in the last term, twenty.

VII.—THE COUNCIL.

The Rev. George Clarke, who has held the office of Vice-Chancellor since the inauguration of the University, was, on the 15th February, unanimously re-elected for the year.

XIII. PARLIAMENTARY APPROPRIATION.

The sum of £4000, fixed by the Tasmanian University Act for payment out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Council of the University, was reduced by special legislation to £2500 for the year 1896, and also for 1897. For 1898 the reduction has been slightly lessened, the appropriation for the year having been fixed at £2900, a sum which is inadequate for the performance of the work which the University ought to do, and which the Council is anxious to undertake.

XIV.—ACCOUNTS.

The audited Account of Income and Expenditure, required by the provisions of "The Tasmanian University Act," is hereto appended.
