

## GENERAL HOSPITAL, LAUNCESTON.

### REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1896.

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to lay before you the following Annual Report of the Board of Management of the above-named Hospital for the year 1896.

1. Messrs. Stanfield, Parker, and Dr. Maddox retired from the Board of Management during the month of December, and were unanimously re-elected.
2. Thirteen Board and forty-three Committee meetings were held during the year.
3. During the month of October, Dr. Drake, Surgeon-Superintendent, returned to his duties after sixteen months' leave of absence, and Dr. Parker, Acting Surgeon-Superintendent, retired. On 11th January, Dr. Ramsay entered on his duties as House Surgeon, taking the place of Dr. C. A. Hogg, resigned.
4. Two students have attended the medical practice, and two students the dental practice.
5. Courses of Lectures have been delivered to the Nurses,—by the Surgeon-Superintendent on Minor Surgery, and by the Lady Superintendent on Nursing.
6. A bacteriological outfit and the scientific apparatus for the production of the "X" rays were purchased during the year. A laboratory is urgently needed to enable the medical officers to take full advantage of these additions to the Hospital.
7. The building of the new Home for Nurses was begun in November, and will be completed during the year 1897.
8. The Hospital is indebted to many citizens for acts of kindness to the patients and staff. During the year several performances were given by private individuals and companies for the entertainment of the patients.
9. The quality of the provisions supplied to the Hospital during the year has, on the whole, been good.
10. The fire apparatus for extinguishing fire has been put in first-class order, and is equal to any ordinary emergency.
11. The verandahs of the main building and Nurses' Home have been repaired and repainted; Surgeon-Superintendent's residence has been repaired, rooms repapered, and ceilings recoloured.
12. The usual detailed information furnished by the Surgeon-Superintendent is embodied in the Report, and is of an interesting character.
