



TERMS OF PETITIONS.

To the Honorable the Legislative Council of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Members of the Church of Rome, residing at [or elsewhere, as the case may be] Morven and its Vicinity.

SHOWETH:

That the Roman Catholic inhabitants of this Colony have been for many years deprived of necessary spiritual instruction, and several of their Clergy subjected to very great privations, on account of the poverty of their people, and the unequal support they have received for their Clergy from the State.

That the Bill for the Re-distribution of the Grant of £15,000 now before your Honorable House will greatly ameliorate that serious evil, by giving to the Roman Catholic Church an equitable share of the Grant in aid of Religion, in accordance with the Census of 1861.

Your Petitioners therefore, with entire confidence in the honor and justice of your Honorable House, earnestly pray that at length justice may be done to their community.
