

The Cascade Establishments, Hobart Town, 29th August, 1871.

Sir.

I have the honor to submit herewith my annual Returns, showing the amount and nature of, and the proceeds from, the labour of the several classes of inmates during the year 1870.

In transmitting these Returns, I have no special observations to make in addition to those contained in my last year's Report.

The cost per head is below that of last year. A minute examination of the Returns will show the thorough working of the Establishments.

As cows are now kept at the Establishment for the supply of milk, a considerable saving in this item will be effected.

With reference to the Reformatory Boys, you will perceive by Return marked J. that the strength has considerably increased.

I may state that the boys are very well conducted, and their progress in secular instruction is satisfactory. They are also instructed in the drill exercise by Mr. Overseer Matthews, who takes great pains with them, and they appear to be making considerable improvement.
