
## TASMANIA:

## SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL EXHIBITION:

FINAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONERS.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Moore, and ordered by the Council to be printed, July 21, 1881.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

THE Commissioners for managing the Tasmanian Contributions to the Sydney International Exhibition, having now completed the duty entrusted to them, desire to present their final Report.

In their Progress Report of the 9th September last they reported the number Paper No. 98, of Medals and Certificates which had been granted. Since then a list of thirteen Session 1880, more awards has been received, and the account of Prizes now stand thus—

Gold Champion Medals	3
Silver Medals to Exhibitors	6
Ditto for Services	
Bronze Medals	
Certificates of Honor	

Parliament having voted the sum of £525 in addition to the first sum of £1000, your Commissioners have been able to meet all their legitimate charges; and the Statistics of the Sydney International Exhibition will bear very favourable comparison with all those of former Exhibitions, as shown in the Appendix to this Report.

The legal means taken for the recovery of money misappropriated by an officer in Sydney have not been successful, and the Commissioners regret to say that the loss from this cause amounts to £165 10s.

Your Commissioners trust that the efforts made by the Colonists through the medium of the Sydney International Exhibition to exhibit the varied and valuable products of the Colony may conduce to the future welfare of Tasmania, by enlarging and strengthening its commercial intercourse with other parts of the world.
