

PETITION.

PROPOSED CUSTOMS' DUTIES.

Presented by Mr. Dunn, and ordered by the House to be printed, 16 January, 1857.



To the Honourable the House of Assembly of Tasmania in Council assembled.

The humble Petition of William Carter, Merchant, of the City of Hobart Town.

SHOWETH:

THAT your Petitioner is induced to approach your Honourable House in consequence of the proposed Tariff, as published in the Government *Gazette* of the 10th instant.

That your Petitioner most earnestly hopes that the same may not become the Law, upon the grounds that it will, if passed, press most heavily, and your Petitioner thinks most distressingly, and most unjustly, upon the working, trading, and poorer classes of the community.

That your Petitioner has given his best consideration to each of the items contained in the said Tariff, as well as to the effect each will have upon the various ranks of persons; and hesitates not to assert that, instead of attaching to the wealthier classes of the community a greater share to the contributions to the Public Revenue than they have hitherto borne, it will have a *contrary effect*.

That your Petitioner ventures to submit, for the information of your Honorable House, the statements attached to and forming part of his Petition, by which your Petitioner makes it appear that the labouring man earning only 30s. per week pays, through the Tariff, to the general Revenue the sum of £8 3s. 4d. per cent., whilst the wealthy man, enjoying an income of £1500 a year, pays, through the same channel, only 12s. 9d. per cent.

That your Petitioner, in Statement No. 1, has divided the articles subject to duty under three heads :----

1st. Those taxed for manufacturing purposes,-molasses, malt, and hops.

2nd. Those consumed by the wealthier classes, such as spirits, wines, cigars, tea, coffee, refined sugars, rice, fruits, and bottled beer.

3rd. Those consumed by the working and lower classes, viz., spirits, tobacco, tea, sugar, and beer.

That the sums of £2900 is produced by articles used for manufacture,—£38,292 for articles consumed by the wealthier classes,—£121,830 for articles consumed by the working and lower classes.

That by Statement No. 2 your Honorable House will perceive that a man whose income is £75 per annum, pays to the public Revenue £8 3s. 4d. per cent.; a man earning £100 per annum will pay £6 2s. 6d. per cent.; £150, ditto £4 1s. 2d. per cent.; £200, ditto £3 1s. 3d. per cent.

That by Statement No. 3 your Honorable House will perceive that a gentleman enjoying an income of $\pounds 600$ per annum will only pay $\pounds 1$ 11s. 9d. per cent.; $\pounds 800$ ditto $\pounds 1$ 3s. 10d. per cent.; $\pounds 1000$, ditto 19s. per cent.; $\pounds 1200$, ditto 15s. 11d. per cent.; $\pounds 1500$, ditto 12s. 9d. per cent.

Your Petitioner therefore humbly prays that your Honorable House will be pleased to take his Petition into its consideration, and so alter the proposed law, that it may in verity equalise the duties, by making the wealthier classes pay more, and the working and poorer classes less, than they have hitherto done towards the public Revenues.

And your Petitioner, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
