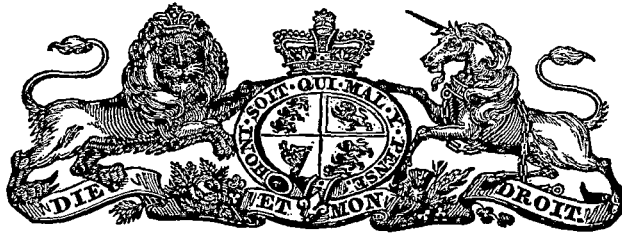

To the Honorable the House of Assembly of Tasmania.

The respectful Petition of the undersigned Landholders and Householders of the County of Cumberland, in Tasmania.

PETITIONERS are deeply interested in the preservation of a pure and sufficient supply of Water in the River Clyde, for the purpose not only of turning their Flour Mills, but also for the use of their households; and they believe that this can be fully and cheaply secured by a Dam at the Lake Crescent, which is the source of the River Clyde, so that the waters of the Lake may be raised to their original height; and they pray that a Bill may be brought into your Honorable House for the purpose of enabling them to erect such a Dam as may be required, and to protect it from damage or destruction.
