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

REPORT OF ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF.

Laid upon the Table by the Minister of Lands, and ordered by the House to be printed, July 16, 1878.





Lands and Works Office, Hobart Town, 16th July, 1878.

Sir,

I have the honor to turnish, for the information of the Government, a Progress Report on the works provided for by Acts of Parliament, 41 Vict. No. 10, and 41 Vict. No. 11, giving particulars of the several contracts entered into; also continuation of Report of Works under previous "Public Works Acts," "Waste Lands Act," and "Local Public Works Acts;" with details of expenditure to 30th June last.

In carrying out these works considerable difficulty has been experienced in obtaining a sufficiently qualified and well-organised Departmental Staff, to lay out and take the necessary particulars for works on the several roads, &c. as sanctioned by Parliament; and great delay has in several instances been caused by this want.

The absence at first of anything like fair competition for many of the works also seriously retarded progress, as in several cases only one tender was received, and sometimes none, frequently necessitating tenders being again invited. Lately, however, I am glad to say, the competition has been much more satisfactory.

I have had to contend with great difficulty through Tenderers failing to comply with the conditions of their Contracts, and neglecting to proceed with their work with vigour and despatch; and I feel that it will be my duty, where any unneccessary delay has occurred, or the works not carried out in strict accordance with the terms of Contract, to recommend the full enforcement of the penalties.

I regret also to represent that delay in several instances has been caused in dealing with the claims of proprietors for compensation where land has had to be acquired for carrying out the purposes of these Acts.

There is attached to each Contract a schedule of prices, upon which the Contract sum is based. These prices apply to extras or deductions that may be ordered by me with the sanction of the Government; and this clause with others are included in the Contracts to prevent difficulties that have occurred in the past.

A certain per-centage on each instalment is also retained by the Government on account of the several Contracts, which is not payable till the completion of the works.

The materials for the several Telegraph Lines have just arrived from England, and the remaining Contracts for these works will at once be entered upon.

In addition to the Road Surveyors or Inspectors in charge of the several Districts there are Sub-Inspectors appointed to superintend the several Contracts where necessary, so as to ensure a faithful performance of the works; and this out-door staff, with the additional assistance as at present employed for clerical and drafting purposes, will, I consider, be sufficient to ensure a steady progress with the remaining works.

My chief difficulty is in being able to find the time for the necessary detailed examination which I have endeavoured to give to the preparation of every plan and specification for the works under "The Public Works Construction Act;" the ordinary duties of the office and supervision of works under other Acts, together with the distance I have travelled during the past year, having absorbed nearly the whole of my time. Under these circumstances I would beg to point out the desirability of an officer being appointed to prepare designs and superintend generally the erection of and repairs to buildings and other works of this character throughout the Island. This would materially relieve me, and allow of my time being devoted to Railways and Special Public Works.

In this Report I desire also to bring under the notice of the Government the working of "The Local Public Works Act;" and would suggest if this Act is to be retained that some improvements be made therein, defining particularly the powers of the Promoters and this Department. The want of this has been a cause of unpleasantness and difficulty in connection with many of the works carried out under this Act.

I am glad to report that on the whole, however, considerable progress has been made with the works for which provision was recently made by Parliament, as will be seen from the particulars herewith; and as many of the preliminary difficulties attending the initiation of such a scheme of works have now been got over, and the staff fairly to work, the progress in the future will be very much more satisfactory than in the past.

CONTINUATION of Report of Special Works carried out under the provisions made by Acts of the Parliament of Tasmania, with Details of Expenditure to 30th June, 1878.

Public Works Construction Act, 1877, 41 Vict. No. 10.

ROAD FROM ELIZABETH TOWN TO LATROBE. VOTE £11,750.

TENDERS were received in January last for the supply of 1000 cubic yards of metal for this road, but being considered too high, none were accepted.

Particulars were taken as soon as possible for works on First section of this road—a distance of about eight miles—plans and specifications prepared, and tenders received for same in February last. That of Mr. J. Clark, at £5123, being the lowest, was accepted, under date 21st February. The Contractor delayed for a considerable time the commencement of these works, and only after being notified that his Contract would at once be cancelled was a beginning made; but operations have been now suspended by him on account of illness, though without previous notice to this office. In reply to remonstrances from this Department a letter has been received, pleading his illness, and enclosing a doctor's certificate of same.

Tenders were also invited in April last for works on Sassafras section of this road—a distance of about two miles,—and that of Messrs Naylor and Laycock, at £1746 17s., accepted, under date 9th May. This Contract is proceeding.

Surveys have been made for a considerable deviation on remaining section of road, in order to avoid the steep hill at the Finger Post and save distance, which surveys have resulted satisfactorily; and particulars of all remaining work on this road, and to be done on this remaining section, are now in this office.

These works are under the supervision of Mr. Frith (overseer of works), with Sub-Inspector Simmons.

GREEN'S CREEK ROAD. VOTE £1000.

Northing has yet been done under this Vote, there being doubts as to the most advisable route. The preparation of Contract is delayed until the route can be examined and reported on.

KENTISHBURY AND BARRINGTON ROAD. VOTE £1500.

Tenders were received in May last for works on this road, but, at the request of a deputation of interested parties, the works as tendered for were not carried out.

Particulars for other works (which include some new bridges not originally intended) have been taken, and tenders received for a Bridge över the River Don—part of the works on this line; and that of Mr. S. Kelcey, at £98, being the lowest, has been accepted.

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ROAD FROM LATROBE TO TORQUAY. VOTE £2750.

Tenders were received in May last for works on this road, and the lowest, that of Mr. John Daly, at £2697 10s., has been accepted, subject, however, to some deductions.

This Contracte is progressing under! Mr. Cresswell's supervision, with assistance of Sub-Inspector.

ROAD FROM LATROBE TO LEVEN. VOTE £7000.

Tenders were received in February last for works on section of this road, from Latrobe to River Forth. That of Mr. C. B. McFenton at £3642; being the lowest, was accepted, under date 6th March, subject, however, to such deductions as may be considered necessary, so as not to exceed the proper proportion of vote for this part of road. Good progress has been made by Mr Fenton, and a large cutting at Howson's Hill is now being carried out.

Tenders were also invited in April for works on section of this road, from Mersey Bridge to Main Road, at Ballahoo; and that of Messrs. Lapthorne and Roberts, at £894, being the lowest, was accepted, under date 1st May, and Contractors have carried on the works with commendable energy.

Tenders were also received on 29th May for works on section of this road, from River Forth to Leven; and that of Messrs. O'Reilly and Swaine, at £1019, being the lowest, was accepted, under date 31st May. Contractors are proceeding with fair spirit.

Surveys have been made for a considerable deviation in line of road between Clayton Rivulet (near end of O'Reilly and Swaine's Contract) and the Leven, by which distance will be shortened, and a good line obtained.

Particulars for Contracts on both the surveyed new line and present line of road have been prepared, but Contracts will not be let until land has been acquired. This matter is in course of arrangement.

These Contracts are progressing under Mr. Cresswell's supervision, who is assisted by a Sub-Inspector.

ROAD FROM LEVEN TO CASTRA. Vote £2000.

Tenders were received in January last for necessary works, forming and metalling, &c. on this road—a distance of about $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles; and that of Mr. J. A. Fogg accepted, at £7 15s. per chain, and 9d. per cubic yard for excavation carried to filling on Second section.

The cost of works under this Contract will, with supervision and contingencies, absorb the provision under this Vote.

This Contract has progressed considerably, and is under Mr. Cresswell's supervision, assisted by Sub-Inspector Jowett.

MERSEY BRIDGE APPROACH. VOTE £1200.

Tenders were received in January last for the construction of this work in accordance with the plans and specifications which were prepared by this Department, and that of Messrs. Lapthorne and Roberts, at £813 15s., was accepted on the 1st February.

This contract is nearly completed, and has been done under the supervision of Mr. R. Oldham in connection with the Inspector of the District, (Mr. Cresswell). The work has been carried on with vigour and in a creditable manner by the contractors.

Considerable difficulty was experienced in negotiating matters for land required for approach,—but these arrangements have lately been completed by arbitration, and the conveyance is now being prepared by the Solicitor-General.

ERECTION OF A BRIDGE OVER THE RIVER CAM. VOTE £1500.

Tenders were received in February last for the erection of this bridge, and that of R. Milburn, at £1086, being the lowest tender, was accepted on 28th March. The contractor, however, soon notified that he had made a mistake in his tender by leaving out cost of coffer-dam for centre pier, and desired some consideration to be shown him. This matter was carefully looked into and compared with official estimates, and as it was evidently genuine (the next lowest tender being about £300 above Milburn's), I recommended that some allowance for the coffer-dam be made to the contractor if the work was carried out to the satisfaction of the Department. This recommendation was sanctioned on the 15th April.

After operations, however, had been commenced great difficulty was experienced in founding the centre pier in position shown on plan, and I then decided to re-arrange the spans of the bridge, making only one large central span, to be built with laminated arched girders, and adding one small side span. These alterations are to be carried out by the contractor at the schedule prices of contract, except that some allowance is to be made for the extra labour involved in building the curved portion of the large girder. The staging is completed, coffer-dam well advanced, and materials are being procured, but, although many different places have been opened, no stone of sufficiently good quality has been found. This work is progressing under Mr. Cresswell's supervision, assisted by Sub-Inspector H. Jowett.

The old bridge having fallen in, temporary repairs were effected at a cost of £20, to provide for traffic. Provision made by Supplementary Estimate.

ERECTION OF SEABROOK BRIDGE, NEAR INGLIS. VOTE £250.

Nothing done under this vote.

ERECTION OF A BRIDGE OVER THE LACHLAN RIVER. VOTE £600.

Plans and Specifications were prepared for Mason's work in connection with this Bridge, and tenders invited in March last, so that this portion of the work might be carried out and foundation got in while river was comparatively dry.

Only one offer was received, which was so excessive that it could not be entertained.
