

ESTABLISHMENT AT THE CASCADES.

REPORT FOR 1873.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Chapman, and ordered by the Council to be printed, July 21, 1874.

Šir,

I have the honor to forward herewith Returns for the year 1873, showing the cost per head of each class. The average amount per head is about the same as last year, and would have been much less, but the provisions were higher in price: for instance—meat one-fourth more per 100 lbs.

I would beg to observe that the cost of Prisoners in the Gaol and House of Correction has been £12 15s. 10d. per head. Deduct one-third of the strength as non-effectives,—such as nursing mothers, sick in Hospital, and those exempted from labour in consequence of old age and infirmity,—the earnings of the effectives would amount to £9 17s. 2d. per head. This, I think, will bear a fair comparison with any of the English or Colonial Prisons.

With regard to the Training School, 12 boys have been apprenticed during the year,—4, under the new rule, receiving weekly wages. I sent circulars to their several masters to report as to the boys' behaviour; and, so far as I have received replies, it is satisfactory to know that they are going on well.
