

PETITION—WESTBURY.

REPEAL OF MUNICIPAL POLICE AND RURAL MUNICIPAL ACTS.

Presented by Mr. Innes; and ordered by the Council to be printed, July 13, 1864.



To the Honorable the Members of the Legislative Council of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the Municipal Council of the Rural Municipality of Westbury in Council duly assembled.

SHOWETH:

That, in the opinion of your Petitioners, it is desirable that the Thirty-third and Thirty-fourth Clauses of "The Municipal Police Act," and the Eighty-fourth Clause of "The Rural Municipalities Act," should be repealed; and that the Thirtieth and Thirty-fifth Clauses of "The Municipal Police Act," and the Eighty-sixth Clause of "The Rural Municipalities Act," should be amended in accordance therewith.

Your Petitioners therefore humbly pray that a Bill may be passed repealing and amending the above-recited Sections accordingly.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
