

## HOSPITAL FOR THE INSANE, CASCADES,

To His Excellency SIR FRANCIS SMITH, Knight, Administrator of the Government of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

WE have the honor to furnish the Annual Report of this Institution for 1879.

The several particulars in respect to its internal economy are set forth in the Returns annexed.

The general health of the Inmates was good, varied of course by occasional cases of sickness, which, with the exception of one death specified in Return marked A, were amenable to medical treatment.

The mental condition of the Patients on the other hand afforded no evidence of improvement; and therefore whilst there were no admissions during the year there were no discharges.

The services of a few Patients capable of working, and willing to do so, were utilised in gardening operations; and those incapacitated for labour had the benefit of the recreation ground as weather permitted.

The resignation during the year of the Hon. Charles Meredith, as a Commissioner of the Institution, caused a vacancy at the Board, which was filled by the appointment of Francis William Mitchell, Esquire.

In conclusion we beg to record our testimony to the satisfactory management of the Establishment, and the zealous manner in which the duties were performed by the several officials connected with it.
