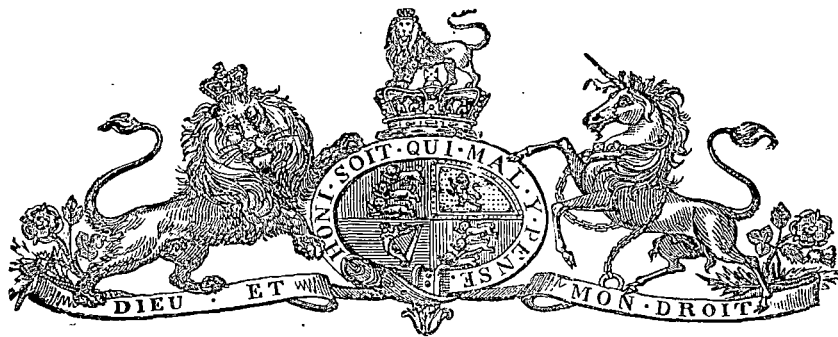

To His Excellency Colonel GORE BROWNE, C.B., Captain-General and Governor-in-Chief of the Island of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Persons in the Civil Service of the Government of Tasmania.

SHOWETH :

THAT your Petitioners have seen with surprise and regret the proposal of the Government to reduce the Status and Salaries of your Petitioners.

That your Petitioners most respectfully represent to Your Excellency that, in making such proposal, regard has not been had to the rights of your Petitioners, and that the contract subsisting between your Petitioners and the Government, as sanctioned by the Governor in Council and ratified by Parliament, has not been adhered to.

That your Petitioners therefore earnestly pray that Your Excellency will be pleased to bring the subject matter of this Petition under the notice of Your Excellency's Advisers, with a view to the re-consideration of the subject.
