- (1) Notes that on 29 May 2025, the Deputy Leader of the Opposition, Ms Anita Dow MP, stated in the House of Assembly that “Our Leader, Hon. Dean Winter MP, is from the west coast, despite what that side might say. He was born on the west coast.”
 - (2) Further notes:—
 - (a) that on 7 May 2025, the Leader of the Opposition, Hon. Dean Winter MP was quoted in the Mercury as saying his parents “drove down to Hobart for the birth before returning home again to Queenstown afterward”;
 - (b) while running for the seat of Hobart, the Leader of the Opposition claimed to be born in Hobart;
 - (c) while running for Kingborough Council, the Leader of the Opposition claimed to be born in Kingston Beach; and
 - (d) on becoming the leader of the Opposition, Mr Winter claimed to be born on the west coast.
 - (3) Calls on the Deputy Leader of the Opposition, Ms Anita Dow MP to immediately correct the record. (3 June 2025)

- (1) Notes that the new Bridgewater Bridge was delivered on time and on budget. (3 June 2025)

- (1) Notes that on the 3 June 2025, Leader of the Opposition, Hon. Dean Winter MP claimed the Government has cut funding to the health technology sector.
 - (2) Agrees that this is demonstrably wrong.
 - (3) Recognises that the Government brought forward \$7.2 million in funding in the 2024-25 financial year, based on the advice of experts at the Department of Health (Budget Paper 2, Vol 1, page 113).
 - (4) Further recognises the Government is implementing a 10-year \$476 million Digital Health Transformation Strategy, ensuring Tasmania’s health system is transformed into a world-class, innovative and integrated system.
 - (5) Further agrees that the 2025-26 Budget invests an additional \$30 million towards this initiative.
 - (6) Further recognises the hard work and commitment of the Digital Transformation team who has delivered multiple valuable projects, which are helping to provide better healthcare faster to Tasmanians around our State, including:—
