

NINETEENTH ANNUAL REPORT, 1887.

THE Ladies' Committee of the Girls' Industrial School, in their Nineteenth Annual Report of the proceedings of this Institution, desire to say that the year's work of the School has had no interruption in its steady progress, and that the health of all the children has been good.

During the year a sale of needlework took place, when enough money was realised to purchase a piano and a sewing machine.

The Jubilee Committee forwarded Five Pounds as a donation to the Institution; and this has been laid out in books, to form the nucleus of a Library for the girls, which have been carefully selected by Lady Fox Young in England, to whom the thanks of the Committee are due.

The Bible Society also presented Jubilee Testaments to each of the girls, and each Testament contained a text especially selected by the Queen, with her autograph attached.

A kind friend anonymously sent Two Pounds for a treat at Christmas, for which the ladies return their thanks.

Mrs. W. L. Crowther, the late President, still evinces a kindly interest in the School, sending her subscription of £2 2s., and also letters and cards to the Matron and girls.

In conclusion, the Committee desire to thank those ladies and gentlemen who have contributed to the welfare of the Institution, both by their labours and contributions, and beg to state that much of the happiness of the inmates has depended upon the kindly interest displayed. To the Matron and the Teachers the Committee desire to return their thanks for their management of the children; and in closing their report, trust that the increasing usefulness of the girls sent from the school from time to time warrant them in urging its claims upon the public.
