



MUNICIPAL POLICE:

COMMISSIONER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1891.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



Police Department, Commissioner's Office, Hobart, 30th July, 1892.

I HAVE the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Police appointed for the several Municipalities within the Colony for the year 1891, in accordance with Section 7 of "The Police Regulation Act, 1865."

I regret I found it impossible to visit the whole of the Municipal Stations during the year. I was prevented by various causes from leaving town as often as I should have wished.

A sufficient staff of Constables was maintained by each Municipal Council to meet the provisions of the Act in the maintenance of order and the preservation of the peace, and for general protection and security; and the charge-rooms, cells, and other watch-house premises were sufficient, and were well maintained.

I append the particulars of the Police Establishment of each Municipality in detail, and also attach the usual Returns relating to offences and offenders furnished by the several Municipal officers.
