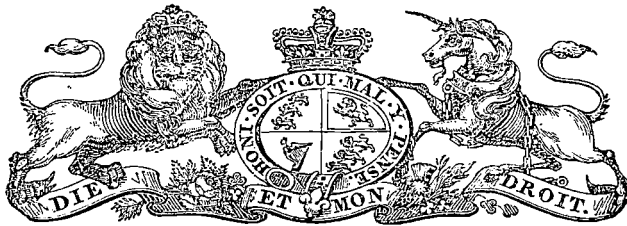

CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL:

REPORT FOR 1892.

---

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.



*REPORT of the Board of Management of the CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL for the Year 1892.*

THE total number of patients treated during the year was 75, as against 67 last year.

The amount received from paying patients was £61 6s. as against £38 12s. for 1891, and £35 18s. for 1890, showing a rapid increase in the appreciation by the public of the institution.

The subscriptions for the year amount to £106 10s. 10d., which is a slight improvement upon 1891, (£84), and upon 1890, (£92), and for this amount we are indebted to voluntary subscriptions from Avoca, £6 16s. 6d., and Ben Lomond, £6 5s.; but I regret to still have to state that many of the large landholders continue to hold aloof.

We have to gratefully acknowledge donations of vegetables, fruit, clothing, books and flowers from Mesdames Leake, Pitt, Tofft, Stormont, Hart, Parramore, Jones, Nicholson; the Misses Turnbull, Valentine, Bell, Power, Finlay; Dr. Tofft, and Mr. C. F. Pitt.

The Medical Officer has, as heretofore, been most assiduous in his attention to the Hospital; and the clergy have taken deep interest in the patients, as evinced by their frequent visits.

The Master and Matron still continue to give the utmost satisfaction, and the Board strongly recommends them for the usual annual gratuity.

It is with regret that I have to state that the Government, through the Honorable the Chief Secretary, has declined to grant the £1 for £1 upon interests on legacies, fixed deposits, and rent of old Grammar School, and that this decision, having a retrospective effect, entails a loss upon the Hospital of £77 for the past half-year, and nearly £100 per annum in the future.

The correspondence upon the subject is at the disposal of the meeting.
