



## REPORT for 1886.

Invalid Depôt, Launceston, 24th January, 1887.

Sir

I HAVE the honor to submit my Annual Report for this Establishment for the year 1886.

#### Admissions and Discharges.

Admissions.—The admissions were 38 less than the previous year. The daily average number of inmates was 128, of which 125:30 were chargeable to the Colonial Government, and 2:69 to Imperial expenditure. The daily average for 1885 was 150:2.

Discharges.—Twelve were transferred to the General Hospital, 10 to the police for breaches of the regulations, 4 abscended, 29 were discharged by the approval of the Administrator of Charitable Grants, and 36 were transferred to the Depôt, New Town. The latter were removed in consequence of the space occupied by them being required for the Contagious Diseases Hospital.

Mortality.—The death rate was 10.034 per cent., as against 9.627 for 1885. The average age at death was 72.034; the maximum being 88 years, and the minimum 47 years. The united ages of 13 oldest who died vere 1059, being an average of 81.46 years.

Ages.—The average ages of inmates was 66.50, inclusive of 9 between 26 and 51 years.

Cost.—The gross expenditure for the year was £1816 4s. 11d., being £255 3s. 5d. less than the amount provided in Estimates. The annual cost per head was £14 3s.  $9\frac{1}{4}d$ . and £13 12s.  $8\frac{1}{2}d$ . on gross and net expenditure respectively, as against £15 5s.  $5\frac{1}{2}d$ . and £14 19s.  $0\frac{1}{2}d$ . for 1885.

Remarks.—The conduct of inmates has (with very few exceptions) been very good. Appended are Returns of Expenditure, Contract Prices, and Decennial Returns.
