

EDWARD THE SEVENTH, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India: To Our Trusty and well-beloved SIR ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Exalted Order of the Star of India, Knight Grand Cross of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Knight Grand Commander of Our Most Eminent Order of the Indian Empire, Greeting.

Appointment of Sir Arthur Elibank Havelock, G.C.S.I., G.C.M.G., G.C.I.E., as Governor.

WE do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manuel and Signet, appoint you, the said Sir Arthur Elibank Havelock, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Governor in and over Our State of Tasmania and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said Office belonging or appertaining.

His duties and powers under Letters Patent constituting the Office of Governor.

II. And we do hereby authorise, empower, and command you to exercise and perfrom all and singular the powers and directions contained in certain Letters Patent, under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date at Westminster, the twenty-ninth day of October, 1900, constituting the Office of Governor in and over our State of Tasmania and its Dependencies, in the Commonwealth of Australia, or in any other Letters Patent adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, and according to such Orders and Instructions as the Governor of the said State has already received or as you may hereafter receive from Us.

Commission of 10th April, 1893, superseded.

III. And We do hereby appoint that, so soon as you shall have taken the prescribed Oaths, and have entered upon the duties of your Office, this Our present Commission shall supersede the Commission under the Sign Manuel and Signet, of Her late Majesty, Queen Victoria, bearing date the 10th day of April, 1893 appointing Our Right Trusty and Well-beloved Cousin Jenico William Joseph, Viscount Gormanston, then Knight Commander, now Knight Grand Cross, of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint Gorges to be Gorges and Cross, of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief of Our Colony of Tasmania and its Dependencies.

Officers, &c., to obey the Governor.

IV. And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers, Ministers, and loving Subjects in our said State and its Dependencies, and all others whom it may concern, to take due notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this Twenty-third day of May, 1901, in the

First year of Our Reign.
