

Exchanges.—The usual Blue Books of the Imperial Parliament, and the Acts, Journals, and Parliamentary Papers of the Colonial Legislatures have been received, as also those valuable papers published by the Smithsonian Institution of the United States of America.

The Library is now also supplied with the bound Journals of the Imperial House of Commons, which the Queen's Printers at my request forward direct by post as soon as issued, and I have applied to have copies of the Public General Acts and of the *Hansard* of the Imperial Parliament supplied in the same manner.

Since my last Report, through the good offices of the Parliamentary Librarians of New South Wales, Victoria, and South Australia, complete bound sets of the Parliamentary Debates of those Colonies have been received in the Library, and future volumes will be regularly supplied. I have also arranged, through the kindness of the Parliamentary Librarian of the Dominion Parliament, to get the Debates of the Senate and of the House of Commons of Canada. These will all prové valuable and welcome additions to the Library.

The Journals and Papers of the Parliament of Tasmania have been forwarded to the various Institutions and Parliamentary Libraries usually supplied.

During the recess the Catalogue of the Library has been thoroughly revised and carefully checked and printed, and it is hoped that the result will add materially to the convenience of Members.

I desire to gratefully acknowledge the ever ready and loyal assistance rendered during the preparation of the Catalogue by Mr. Freney, the Assistant Librarian, services which I am sure the Committee and Members generally entirely appreciate.
