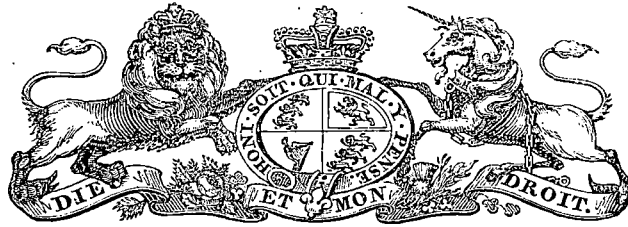

REPORT of the CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL, 1885.

Campbell Town, 1st February, 1886.

SIR,

WE have the honor to forward the Annual Report of the Campbell Town Hospital for 1885.

The Trustees report that the finances of the Hospital are in a good and sound condition. The Accounts have been audited as usual.

2. They have much pleasure in stating that a donation of £100 has been received from Mrs. Horton, of Somercotes, Ross, by way of anticipated legacy; that good lady having very kindly paid the money now to aid in building operations.

3. The amount collected on "Hospital Sunday" was £32 14s. This is very gratifying, and calls for our warmest acknowledgments to the district clergy and general public.

4. The late Mr. Saunders having been intimately connected with this Hospital from its inception, being a regular subscriber to its funds, and a very constant visitor, the Trustees cannot allow this opportunity to pass without recording their appreciation of his services to the Hospital.

5. Correspondence with the Government with reference to the new Hospital building and site has resulted in the Trustees being authorised to dispose of the old premises in aid of the new Hospital, plans of which have been approved by the Government, and the Minister of Lands and Works has been instructed to decide upon the boundaries of the new site in East-street.

6. The Trustees report for information of subscribers, that they have sold the old Hospital premises to Mr. Wm. Melville, of this town, for £300.

7. Dr. Naylor has well earned the thanks of the community by his painstaking care of the sick during the past year, several cases of compound fracture needing unremitting attention, and Mr. Raiker's conduct has been very praiseworthy.

8. The triennial election of Trustees takes place to-day.
