



REPORT FOR 1891.

REPORT OF THE DEVON COTTAGE HOSPITAL, 1891.

(Incorporated under "The Charitable Institutions Act.")

I have the honor to report as follows:-

The third year of the Hospital's work has brought a large increase in the number of cases,—79 being treated, as against 53 in 1890. An additional ward for women has been provided; the wards cleansed and disinfected; and the water supply, both hard and soft, made thoroughly efficient. The Medical Officer has been most assiduous in the discharge of his office; and the general work of the Hospital has been carried on in a manner fully satisfactory.

It is gratifying to report that in this year—a disastrous one for the County of Devon—the support given to the Hospital has been adequate to its needs.

The cases dealt with during the year were 79, viz., 60 males and 19 females; of which were discharged cured, 53; benefited, 10; no better, 6; died, 5; remaining in Hospital, 5.
