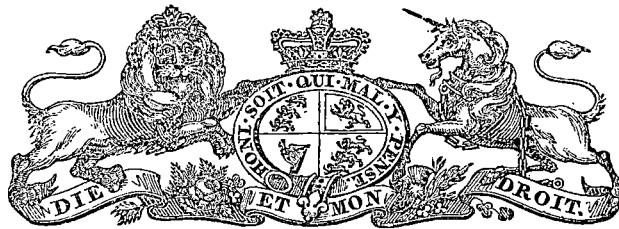

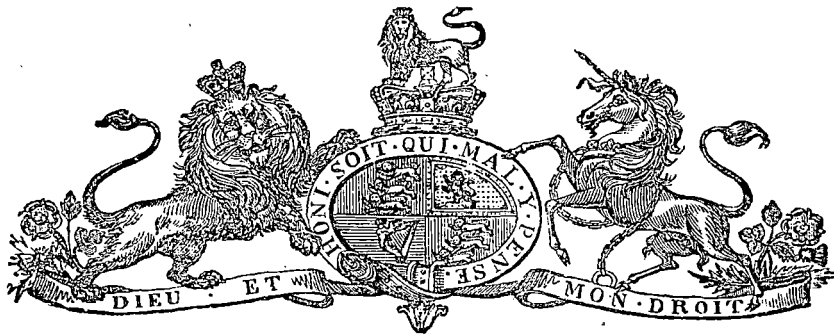

SIR,

I HAVE the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch, No. 98, of the 9th of October, enclosing a letter addressed to you by Brigadier-General Chute, in which he urges the necessity of despatching Troops from this country to Tasmania, to supply the place of those sent to New Zealand.

I do not abandon the hope that the state of New Zealand may render it soon possible to restore the Troops who have been despatched thither.
