

Downing-street, 19th June, 1868.

Sir,

I HAVE received your Despatch, marked "Separate," of the 28th of March, accompanied by Addresses to Her Majesty from the Inhabitants of the principal Towns of Tasmania, relative to the attempted Assassination of His Royal Highness the Duke of Edinburgh.

I am commanded to instruct you to assure the Inhabitants of Tasmania that Her Majesty cordially appreciates the spirit of loyalty to the British Crown, and of attachment to the Person and Family of the Sovereign, displayed in the Addresses which you have transmitted to me.
