

CRIMINAL STATISTICS.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Attorney-General, and ordered by the House to be printed, 18 September, 1861.



Office of Inspector of Police, 11th September, 1861.

Sir,

I HAVE the honor to forward, for the information of the Government, Statistical Returns of Crime committed within the Rural Districts and Municipalities of Tasmania during the year 1860.

It appears that in the Rural Districts 585 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 391 persons were apprehended, of whom 289 were committed or summarily dealt with.

In the Municipality of Hobart there were 194 similar offences reported, for which 135 persons were apprehended, of whom 129 were committed or summarily dealt with.

In the Municipality of Launceston 107 indictable offences were reported, for which 76 persons were apprehended, of whom 67 were committed or summarily dealt with.

In the Rural Municipality of Glamorgan 4 similar offences were reported, for which 2 persons were apprehended, of whom 1 was summarily dealt with.

This state of crime does not show any marked variation from the Returns of the previous year, but, on the whole, a slight decrease is apparent. As, however, the crime-committing population diminishes by the emigration or other disposal of our "habitual criminals," offences to which they are prone will become less frequent, and the crimes of atrocity and magnitude which occasionally startle and alarm this community be more rare of commission.

The publication of the Crime Report, for Police circulation only, has answered my most sanguine expectations; detection and apprehension of offenders have been considerably facilitated since the date of its first issue, and, from the Reports of the Inspectors of Police of the United Kingdom, I find that the detection of crime in this Colony bears a very favourable comparison with that in the Mother Country, where the Police, from its constitution, numerical strength, and means available for rapid communication, is of the most efficient character.

I also annex Returns of the authorised Government Police Establishments in Tasmania, of penalties paid to the Force, of property stolen and recovered by the Police, and of Coroners' Inquests held throughout the Territory, during the year 1860.
