

# NEW TOWN CHARITABLE INSTITUTION.

## REPORT FOR 1895.

New Town, 31st March, 1896.

Sir

I HAVE the honor to submit herewith the Annual Report of the New Town Charitable Institution for the Year 1895.

#### Strength.

The number of inmates on the books during the year was—Males, 599; females, 310—total, 909, or 54 less than in 1894.

The actual number of inmates on the 31st December last was 523, a decrease of 15 on the corresponding date of the previous year; this number includes 10 children.

The highest number of inmates at any one time was 577; compared with 1894 this shows a decrease of 17. The lowest number was 504, or 9 more as compared with 1894.

The average daily number during the year was 545.88, being a decrease of 3.15 on the previous year.

## Admissions.

The number admitted during the year was 371, or 77 less than the previous year.

#### Discharges.

The number discharged was 300, as against 313 in 1894.

## Mortality.

The deaths during the year numbered 86, or 946 per cent., as against 112, or 1163 per cent. in 1894. The average age of those who died was 7495 years, the maximum age being 98 and the minimum 23 years. The average age of the 15 oldest was 8860—28 averaged over 80 years of age. Fuller particulars under this head will be found in the tables in the Appendices.

### Expenditure.

The gross expenditure for the year was £5952 3s. 4d., being £3 14s. 11d. less than in 1894. The receipts from all sources were £735 16s. 10d., being £116 13s. 10d. more than the receipts for the previous year. The net expenditure was £5216 6s. 6d., as against £5336 15s. 3d. for 1894, or £120 8s. 9d. less.

The cost per head on gross expenditure was £10 18s. 1d., as against £10 17s. in 1894. The cost per head on net expenditure was £9 11s. 1d., as against £9 14s. 5d. in 1894.

During the year Customs duties were paid on tea, sugar, spirits, and tobacco to the extent of

£382 11s. 8d.

The sum charged to Imperial Government for maintenance of Imperial paupers during the year was £348 5s. 3d. This with the amount paid for Customs duty if deducted from the expenditure would reduce the net cost per head to £8 4s. 4d. per annum, or  $5\frac{1}{4}d$ . per diem.

#### Repairs and Improvements.

A sum of £91 3s. 6d. was expended under this head during the year; nearly the whole of this was for material and gas laid on in Lying-in Hospital and in two passages. Many of the wards, offices, &c. were painted and renovated by inmate labour.

#### Garden.

24,787 lbs. of vegetables, valued at £38 14s. 7d., were raised and used in the Institution, and £11 2s. 9d. worth were supplied to the Gaol.

#### Farm.

The annexed Return, marked E., will show the operations of the Farm for 1895. It will be observed that the working of the Farm resulted in a profit of £179 19s. 4d. for the year.

## $Religious\ Services.$

During the year the Chaplains, Lay Preachers, Sisters of Charity, Flower Mission, Christian Endeavour Societies, Ladies' Reading Committee, Salvation Army, and others have, as usual, attended to the spiritual wants of the inmates.

## Entertainments, Treats, &c.

Several entertainments were given during the year, and were much appreciated by the inmates.

Roast beef and plum pudding were given by the Government on Queen's Birthday and Christmas Day, and the Cascade Brewery Company, with their usual generosity, sent a hogshead of ale on the latter day.

Donations of bacon, cheese, fruit, tobacco, and pipes were received from Messrs. Roberts and Co., Mrs. Rout, Messrs. R. Walker & Co., and Bishop Delaney.

Hon. F. W. Piesse, M.L.C., and Mr. J. Bowman subscribed the sums of £1 and £2 2s. respectively for the purchase of extras for inmates.

### Lying-in Home.

The Lying-in Home having been transferred from the Cascades to this Institution in March last, the first case was admitted on the 31st of that month. From that date up to the end of the year 12 cases were admitted; births 9—4 males and 5 females. In addition to above one woman was brought to Institution by Police under charge of manslaughter by exposure of her child not 24 hours old, and which child died soon after she was admitted; one woman was admitted from the Gaol upon the order of the Governor in Council. Her husband died soon after her admission, and she was discharged before her confinement. Three women remained in the Home at the end of the year awaiting confinement.

# Library.

The proprietors of the Mercury, Church News, and Monitor have, as usual, supplied free copies of their publications; and books, periodicals, &c. have been presented by many kind friends of the Institution.
