

EIGHTH REPORT of the Inspector of Constabulary and Police Forces of the Municipalities of Tasmania, for the Year ending 30th June, 1865. (Pursuant to 21 Vict. No. 13.)

In submitting for His Excellency the Governor's information my Eighth Annual Report on the state and efficiency of the several Constabulary and Police Forces of the Municipalities in Tasmania, inspected by me during the year ending 30th June last, I have the honor to represent to you that they have maintained their Police Establishments in a satisfactory state of efficiency with the exception of the Town of Launceston, adverted to elsewhere, where the numerical strength has been unadvisedly reduced.

I am happy to add, that I have everywhere been courteously received by the authorities: the only subject on which any unwillingness on their part generally to co-operate in my views has been expressed being the retention of the Reward and Superannuation Fund, and the adoption of Rules for its appropriation; the beneficial effects of which,—not only in securing the continued services of experienced and intelligent men, but conducing, as it must, to giving them a fixed interest in the service,—would, I feel convinced, be very soon apparent.

I regret that the Police Regulation Bill of the present Session of Parliament ignores existence of this Fund.

No Rural Municipalities have been established, but I found a disposition existing on the part of two Police Districts shortly to avail themselves of the provisions of the 21st Vict. No. 13.

Crime generally, and particularly that of a serious character, is steadily decreasing, and its detection, considering the few facilities there exist in the interior for rapid communication, continues on the average highly satisfactory. It is very probable that on the carrying out of the Public Works projected in this Session of Parliament, and the institution of Railways, an increase to the authorised Forces of Municipalities in which these may exist will be found necessary; but I have no doubt when the time arrives this question will be liberally dealt with by the authorities.

Annexed I furnish the usual Return showing the authorised strength and pay of the Municipal Police Forces.

MUNICIPALITIES.

The constitution and numerical strength of this Force remains unaltered since my last inspection, and its efficiency has been satisfactorily maintained during the past year. It consists of—

1 Superintendent; 2 Sub-Inspectors; I Acting Sub-Inspector; 4 Serjeants; 2 Detective Constables, with the rank and pay of Serjeants, and 30 Petty Constables.

The Slaughter-houses in the City are under the supervision of a Petty Constable, who is not, however, borne on its effective strength.

The Superintendent reports favourably of the conduct of his officers and men, who presented a smart appearance on parade: and the diminution in the number of offences committed, accompanied with increased detection, is a fair test of protection being satisfactorily afforded to the City.

The Force is acquiring greater permanence in service of its members, one Petty Constable only having left it during the past year; and this is being encouraged, if not secured, by an increase of pay with a good conduct stripe being authorised to the Sub-Inspectors, Serjeants, and Petty Constables. After seven years service with good conduct on an authorised scale shown in the Appendix hereto, 2 Sub-Inspectors, 1 Acting Sub-Inspector, 4 Serjeants, 2 Detective Officers, and 6 Petty Constables are now receiving their extra rate of pay.

The Uniform, together with the Accoutrements issued in January, were in good condition and of good quality.

The Barracks, Station-house, Wards, and Cells were in good repair, orderly, and cleanly; but more frequent whitewashing of the latter would be found beneficial.

A Medical Officer attends the Station-house, but the men are not entitled to his gratuitous services.

During the year ending 30th June last, one Petty Constable had left the Force by resignation. Within a similar period 306 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 211 persons had been apprehended, of whom 163 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Books, Records of Crime, and Returns continue to be correctly kept in prescribed form. The Acting Sub-Inspector continues to perform the duties of Summoning Officer and Inspector of Lodging-houses.

LAUNCESTON.

The constitution of this Force has been slightly changed, and its numerical strength, I think, unadvisedly reduced since my last inspection, by dispensing with I Serjeant (promoted on the resignation of a Sub-Inspector to the rank of Acting Sub-Inspector), and I Police Constable. It now consists of—

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 1 Acting Sub-Inspector, 2 Detective Constables, and 13 Petty Constables.

This reduction in strength, although not destroying the hitherto acknowledged efficiency of the Force, has seriously impaired it, and left certain outlying streets of the Town totally unprotected by night. To this I called the attention of the Municipal Authorities, recommending an augmentation of a Petty Constable; and as my suggestions have hitherto been cordially received by the Municipal Council, I trust my recommendation will be shortly adopted, and the Force restored to its former state of efficiency.

The Superintendent was absent on leave, but the Sub-Inspector in charge gave me a very favourable report of the conduct of the men, none of whom had left since my last inspection. They were their new Uniform which was of excellent quality, their Accourrements were in good serviceable order, and I was well satisfied with their demeanour and appearance on parade. During the year ending 30th June last, I Sub-Inspector and I Petty Constable had resigned; and during a corresponding period there had been a marked diminution in indictable offences, 89 of which had been reported to the Police, for which 60 persons had been apprehended, of whom 41 were committed for trial or summarily convicted.

The Barracks, Station-house, and Cells were in good repair and cleanly; but, as I have annually

reported, increased accommodation for the temporary confinement of prisoners is still much required. The Books, Records of Crime, and Returns were systematically and correctly kept. A Medical Officer attends the Station-house, but the Force is not entitled to his gratuitous professional services.

RURAL MUNICIPALITIES.

The constitution and authorised numerical strength of this Force was found unchanged, though a vacancy for a Special Constable remained open on my inspection. It is efficient, and consists of 1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 2 Petty Constables, and 9 Special Constables. There had been one resignation from the Force, viz., of the Superintendent, and one dismissal, that of a Special Constable, during the year ending 30th June last. Within the same year there had been a very considerable increase of indictable offences, 49 of which had been reported to the Police, for which 39 persons had been apprehended, all of whom had been committed for trial or summarily convicted, marking a very creditable system of detection. The Wards and Cells were cleanly and in good order, the Station-houses in good repair, and the Books, Records of Crime, and Returns correctly kept. The Force is not, as I have before noted, clothed in Uniform, but the Arms and Accoutrements were in good order. No Medical man is attached to it. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

SPRING BAY.

This Force remains wholly unaltered since my last inspection, and is efficient. It consists of-

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 3 Petty Constables, and 3 Special Constables.

The suggestions offered by me last year have been adopted, and the neighbouring settlers' establishments are occasionally visited by the Constables. There have been neither resignations nor dismissals from the Force during the year ending 30th June last, and the amount of crime committed in the Municipality has been trifling,—11 indictable offences only having been reported to the Police during the year, for which 8 persons were apprehended, of whom 6 were committed for trial or summarily convicted.

The fence wanted to complete the Station-house arrangements has not yet been built. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were in good order and cleanly, and the Books, Records of Crime, and Returns properly kept. The undress Uniform worn by the Force, together with their Arms and Accountrements, were in good order.

The Superintendent holds the appointments of Clearing Officer of Customs, Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

No Medical Officer is attached to the Force.

CLARENCE.

There has been no alteration whatever in this Force, which is efficient, and consists of-

1 Superintendent, 1 Serjeant, 2 Petty Constables, and 3 Special Constables.

Further convenient alterations have been made in the Station-house at Bellerive, the Wards and Cells of which were in good order and cleanly, as well as those in that at Rokeby.

The amount of Crime committed during the year ending 30th June last had been trifling,—17 indictable offences having been reported to the Police, for which 8 persons had been apprehended, of whom 6 were committed or summarily convicted; and during the three months previous to my inspection there had not been one person confined in the Head-station at Bellerive.

No resignations nor dismissals from the Force had occurred during the same period, but there was a vacancy for a Special Constable not filled up.

The Serjeant's pay has been raised to 5s. a day, but no alteration has been made in that of the Petty Constables. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, Examiner of Weights and Measures, and Inspector of Roads.

No Medical man is attached to this Force.

RICHMOND.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength or constitution. It is efficient, and consists of—
1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 1 Serjeant, and 4 Petty Constables.

The Wards and Cells in the Station-house, formerly the Gaol, were cleanly and in good repair. The Uniform worn by the Force was in good serviceable order, and their Arms and Accoutrements equally so. No dismissals nor resignations from the Force had occurred during the year ending 30th June last, during which period 60 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 40 persons were apprehended, of whom 25 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Books, Records of Crime, Returns, &c. were correctly kept. A Medical Officer is appointed to attend the Station-house. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

OATLANDS.

An augmentation of one Petty Constable has been made to this Force since my last Inspection, and its efficiency further increased by the establishment of a Police and Escort Station at Melton Mowbray on the Main line of road, to the support of which the adjoining Municipality of Bothwell contributes. A Station is also in course of erection at Rumney's Huts on the road to Little Swanport, where a Constable will be stationed; and when this is established the Force will be a very efficient one both in numerical strength and organisation. It now consists of—

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 2 Acting Serjeants, 6 Petty Constables, and 3 Special Constables.

Permanency of service is of a satisfactory character, no dismissals nor resignations from the Force having occurred during the year ending 30th June, 1865. During a corresponding period 49 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 24 persons were apprehended, of whom 19 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Station-house, formerly the Gaol, Cells, and Wards were in good repair and cleanly; and the Books, Records of Crime, Returns, &c. intelligently and correctly kept. The Uniform worn by the Force, and their Arms and Accoutrements, were in good order. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. The Constable in charge of Tunbridge Station is also an Inspector of Stock and Pound-keeper.

The constitution of this Force has undergone a slight change since my last inspection, which, however, does not affect its authorised numerical strength nor efficiency. It now consists of—

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 1 Serjeant, and 6 Petty Constables.

Greater permanency of service in this Force is desirable.

During the year ending 30th June last, 3 Petty Constables resigned and 1 was dismissed. Within a corresponding period, 35 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 19 persons were apprehended, of whom 17 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Station-house, formerly the Gaol, Out-stations, Wards, and Cells, were cleanly and in good repair; and the Books, Records of Crime, and Returns correctly kept. The Uniform and Accountrements were in serviceable order, but the former will require to be renewed at the end of the year. A monthly deduction of 5s. is now made from the pay of the men as a contribution towards its cost.

The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. No Medical Officer is attached to this Force.

No change has occurred since my last inspection in the constitution and numerical strength of this Force; but the pay of the Superintendent has very properly been increased from £120 to £175 a year, and that of the Petty Constables to 4s. 9d. per day. It is efficient, and consists of—

1 Superintendent and 3 Petty Constables.

Additional accommodation in the Station-house is desirable, the Wards and Cells of which were in good repair and cleanly. No resignations nor dismissals from the Force were recorded during the year ending 30th June last. During the last year 48 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 32 persons had been apprehended, of whom 19 were committed for trial or summarily convicted.

The clothing and accoutrements were in good condition. The Books, Records of Crime, Returns, &c., were correctly and intelligently kept. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

There has been no alteration whatever in this Force since my last inspection. It is an efficient one, and consists of—

1 Superintendent, 6 Petty Constables, and 1 Special Constable.

The Uniform worn by the Force was in good condition (its cost being now deducted from their pay at the rate of 4d. a day), as well as the Arms and Accoutrements. During the year ending 30th June no resignations nor dismissals from the Force occurred. Within a corresponding period there had been 46 indictable offences reported to the Police, for which 38 persons were apprehended, of whom 28 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Head and Out-station Houses, Cells, and Wards were in good repair and cleanly; and the Books, Records of Crime, Returns, &c. correctly kept. A Medical Officer is attached to the Head Station. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

A reduction of one Petty Constable has been made during the past year, but the efficiency of the Force has not been affected thereby, as the duties performed by him have been transferred to the Constable now stationed at Melton Mowbray in the Municipality of Oatlands, to the maintenance of which Station the Municipal Council of this Municipality contributes, the Constable at Black Marsh having been removed. It now consists of—

1 Superintendent, 1 Serjeant, and 3 Petty Constables.

The additional Out-station alluded to in my last Report has been built and occupied.

During the year ending 30th June last 3 Petty Constables resigned from the Force, one of whom subsequently rejoined it. Within a corresponding period 21 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 12 persons were apprehended, of whom 8 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Station-houses, Cells, and Wards were in good repair and cleanly; and the Books, Records of Crime, and Returns correctly kept. The Uniform, Arms, and Accourrements of the Force were in good order. No Medical Man is attached to the Station-house. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

No change in either the numerical strength or constitution of this Force has occurred since my last inspection. It is efficient, and consists of—:

1 Superintendent, 2 Petty Constables, and 2 Special Constables.

The amount of crime committed in this Municipality is trifling. During the year ending 30th June last one Petty and one Special Constable resigned; and during a corresponding period 11 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 8 persons were apprehended, of whom 5 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Clothing was in good condition, and the Arms and Accourtements in good order.

A contribution is still made towards the maintenance of the Tunbridge Station in the Oatlands Municipality. The Station-house, Wards, and Cells were cleanly and in good repair; and the Books, Records of Crime, and Returns accurately kept. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

This Force remains unaltered in constitution or numerical strength since my last inspection, maintaining its efficiency, and consists of—

1 Superintendent, 3 Sub-Inspectors, 1 Serjeant, and 6 Petty Constables.

A new Police Station has been erected at the head of George's Bay, affording more extended protection to that locality.

During the year ended 30th June last there was one dismissal from the Force; viz., a Sub-Inspector; and within a similar period 28 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 18 persons were apprehended, 16 of whom were committed for trial or summarily convicted, denoting a high average of detection.

The Head and Out-stations, Wards, and Cells were in good repair and cleanly; and the Books and Records of Crime and Returns accurately kept. The Uniform Clothing, Arms and Accourtements, were in good condition.

No Medical Officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

This Force remains unaltered in numerical strength or constitution. It is efficient, and consists of-

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 1 Serjeant, and 4 Petty Constables.

A Petty Constable is stationed at Bridgewater Station, which is still in charge of an Officer of the Territorial Police. During the year ending 30th June last one Petty Constable was dismissed from the Force; and during a corresponding period 51 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 27 persons were apprehended, of whom 19 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Head Station and Out Stations were in good repair, and the Cells and Wards cleanly, and the Books, Records of Crime, and Returns correctly kept. The Uniform Clothing, and the Arms and Accourtements, were in good condition. No Medical Officer is attached to the Force. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

HAMILTON.

The constitution of this Force has undergone an alteration, though its numerical strength remains the same; a Petty Constable having been promoted to a Sub-Inspectorship. It now consists of—

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 4 Petty Constables (one of whom is an Acting Serjeant), and 1 Special Constable, the latter being required to complete the establishment.

During the year ending 30th June last, 1 Petty Constable was discharged on account of ill-health, 1 was dismissed, and 1 resigned: the latter subsequently rejoined the Force.

During a corresponding period 16 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 14 persons

were apprehended, of whom 11 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The Station-houses, Wards, and Cells were in good repair and cleanly; and the Books, Records of Crime, and Returns accurately kept. The Uniform Clothing, Accourtements and Arms, were in good condition. A Medical Man is attached to the Force, and the Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

BRIGHTON.

This Force remains the same in numerical strength and constitution, but the pay of the Superintendent has very properly been raised to £175 a year, and an increase of 3d a day authorised to the men.

It is efficient, and consists of—1 Superintendent, 2 Serjeants, and 2 Petty Constables,—the augmentation projected on my last inspection not having been authorised.

During the year ending 30th June, 1 Constable died, 1 was dismissed, and 2 resigned. Greater permanence in the Force is desirable.

During a similar period 29 indictable offences had been reported to the Police, for which 24 persons were apprehended, of whom 14 were committed or summarily convicted.

The Station-houses were in good repair, and the Wards and Cells cleanly. The Uniform clothing worn by the Force was in good condition, and the Arms and Accourtements equally so.

No Medical Officer is attached to the Station.

The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

WESTBURY.

This Force remains unaltered in constitution and numerical strength since my last inspection. It is a very efficient one, and consists of—

1 Superintendent, 2 Serjeants, and 6 Petty Constables.

New Stations have been erected at Westwood, M'Kinnon's Ford, and the Oaks; the latter containing a Lock-up, and a Station rented at Exton. The permanent establishment of these Stations has greatly improved the general Police arrangements of the Force, and increased its efficiency. During the year ending 30th June last, there were two resignations from the Force; viz., the Superintendent and a Petty Constable; and within a corresponding period there had been 66 indictable offences reported to the Police, for which 52 persons were apprehended, of whom 17 were committed for trial or summarily convicted. The apparent unusual number of acquittals is not accounted for. The Uniform Clothing was new and of excellent quality, and the Arms and Accourtements were in good order.

The Station-houses were in good repair, a cooking shed having been erected in the yard of that at Westbury, and the Wards and Cells were cleanly. A Medical Officer is attached to the Force; and the Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

No change whatever has occured in this Force since my last Inspection. It is an efficient one, and consists of-

1 Superintendent, 1 Serjeant, and 4 Petty Constables.

During the year ending 30th June last no vacancies had occurred, either by resignation or dismissal, and the permanence of service in the Force is therefore satisfactory. During a corresponding period 98 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 76 persons were apprehended, of whom 70 were committed for trial or summarily convicted, denoting a good average of detection. The Station-houses were in good repair, and the Wards and Cells cleanly. A cooking shed has been erected in the yard of that at Deloraine. The Books, Records of Crime, and Returns were correctly kept. The Uniform Clothing was in good condition, and the Arms and Accoutrements in good order. A Medical Man is attached to the Force; and the Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures.

Since my last Inspection this Force has been augmented and reconstituted, and is now a very efficient one. It consists of—

1 Superintendent, 1 Sub-Inspector, 1 Serjeant, 2 Petty Constables, and 1 Mounted Patrol.

There are 2 Out-stations; viz.— New Town and Bilton's Bridge, at each of which 1 Constable is stationed. A Constable is also stationed at Bridgewater Station, which is still, as I have before observed, in charge of a Territorial Officer of Police. During the year ending 30th June last 1 Petty Constable resigned and 1 was dismissed, and during a similar period 24 indictable offences were reported to the Police, for which 16 persons had been apprehended, of whom 16 were committed for trial or summarily convicted, showing a high average of detection. The Station-houses were in good repair, and the Wards and Cells cleanly, but there is a great want of accommodation in the Head Station-house,—which the Municipal Council, however, propose soon to remedy by the erection of new Buildings. The Books, Records of Crime, and Returns were correctly kept. The Superintendent holds the appointments of Summoning Officer of the Court of General Sessions, Inspector of Stock, and Examiner of Weights and Measures. There is no Medical Officer attached to the Force.
