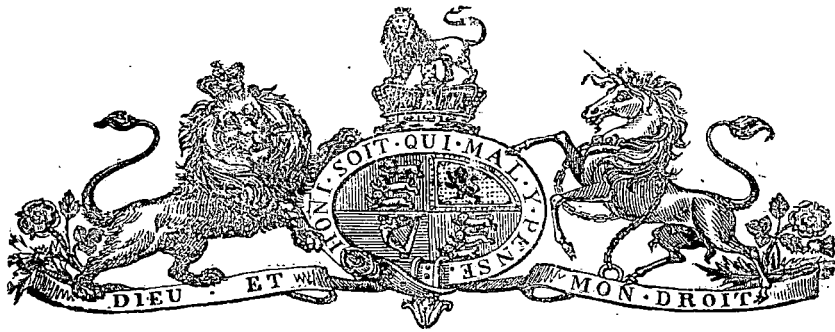

REPORT of the CAMPBELL TOWN HOSPITAL, 1877.

THE Trustees report a small balance in favour of the Hospital on 31st December last of £48 9s. 5d., proving the necessity for some extraordinary exertion to supplement the funds. This has now been happily effected by the Bazaar held here in the early part of this month; the nett proceeds, £150 3s. 6d., form a welcome addition to the General Fund.

It will be borne in mind that our previous effort in this direction enabled the Hospital to liquidate the outstanding claims then due, and meet all liabilities during a period of four years, leaving the balance in hand now reported.

The number of cases treated during the year was 62, at an average cost of 4s. 0½d. per day per patient: of this number 4 only have died in the Hospital, 5 remain under treatment, and 53 have been discharged.

86 out-door patients have received treatment, and 72 children were vaccinated during the year.

The patients have been regularly visited by a minister of religion, and Mr. and Mrs. Raiker have efficiently performed the duties of the Hospital. The Medical Officer has been attentive to his duties and taken great interest in the Institution.

The Treasurer reports a sum of £185 5s. 10d. to credit at this date; and that by general desire of the Trustees the deposit account of the Hospital has been transferred from Launceston to the Bank of Australasia, Campbell Town.

The Trustees have much gratification in reporting to the Subscribers that a handsome bequest of £250 has been left to the Hospital by the late T. D. Robertson, Esq., of Bloomfield.
