



PETITION FROM CUMBERLAND.

Presented by Mr. Gellibrand, and ordered by the House to be printed, 22 August, 1859.



To the Honourable the Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

The Petition of the undersigned Holders of Public-house Licences in the District of Cumberland, in Tasmania.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That under the existing Licensing Act they are compelled to pay a Licence Fee of Fifty Pounds.

That they cannot sell Liquors except within such Licensed House without subjecting themselves to a fine.

They respectfully represent that Hawkers and other persons engaged in traffic are in the constant habit of conveying Spirits about the Country, which they sell or barter to the injury of those who pay for a Licence to sell such Spirits.

They therefore humbly pray that your Honourable House will take the premises into consideration, and, by Enactment or otherwise, protect them in the exercise of their lawful calling.
