


PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

CATTLE QUARANTINE LAWS:

PETITION FROM STOCK-OWNERS FOR AMENDMENT OF.

Presented by Mr. Falkiner on Thursday, 2nd October; and ordered by the House to be printed, Wednesday, 8th October, 1884.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

WE, the undersigned Stock-owners, respectfully pray your Honorable House to take into consideration, with a view to amending, the Clause in the Quarantine Regulations enforcing six months' detention, and that you will be pleased to relax this Regulation to the extent of allowing cattle to pass at the expiration of three months if certified to by the Government Inspector.
