



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

SALE OF POISONS BILL:

PETITION FOR AMENDMENT OF PROVISIONS RELATING TO HOMEOPATHIC MEDICINES.

Laid upon the Table by Mr. Lette, September 15, and ordered by the House of Assembly to be printed, September 22, 1886.



To the Honorable the Speaker and Members of the House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned,

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

That a Bill is now before your Honorable House to regulate the Sale of Poisons.

That whilst fully recognising the desirableness of such a measure, your Petitioners regret that Homocopathic Medicines of the strength mentioned in Section 14 have been included in its operation.

That no danger can possibly arise from the wrong administration of Medicines containing not more than one per cent. of the crude drug, and that to bring them under the operation of the Act would be an unnecessary and vexatious interference.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that your Honorable House will not pass the Bill in its present form, but will so amend it that its provisions shall not apply to Homocopathic Medicines containing not more than one per cent. of the crude drug which they represent.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray, &c.
