REPORT OF COMMISSIONERS TO REGULATE THE AFFAIRS OF THE LIBRARY DURING THE RECESS.

Laid upon the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, November 29, 1871.



MAY IT PLEASE YOUR EXCELLENCY.

On behalf of the Commissioners appointed by Your Excellency on the 23rd January last to regulate the affairs of the Parliamentary Library during the Recess of Parliament, I beg to forward the Librarian's Report on the state of the Library at the date of the last Annual Inspection.

Additional accommodation is much required, so that the Books-many of which are of great value-may be better classified and arranged.

SIR,

AGREEABLY to the Rules of the Parliamentary Library, I present my Report of the Annual Inspection of the Books, which are insured, at a premium of £6 per annum, in the Liverpool and London and Globe Company for the sum of £2000; their cost price to the Colony having been about £2550.

Three Books which have been missing for some years have been returned during the Recess; viz.; Rumford's Essays, 3 vols., Forester's Corsica, Great Schools of England; but at this date there are 53 Yolumes which cannot be traced,—they have been taken out by Members or Visitors without informing the Library Attendant, the Doorkeeper, or myself; but this is the total number unaccounted for since the establishment of the Library in October, 1856.

The number of Books in the Library at date of last Report (13 August, 1870), was 7230; 58 have been added since by purchase,—making the number now 7288, exclusive of bound Volumes of Magazines and Newspapers.

'A large case of Patent Specifications has been received, and the contents have been placed in the Custom House Vaults, for want of better accommodation for these very valuable Presents to the Colony.

The Library and Reading Rooms have been largely visited during the Recess by persons from other Colonies and India; and also by Students of the various Superior Schools, who come to refer to our valuable Classical Library.

I annex a List of Books purchased since last year's Report; and a List of Books not in their places when I made my Annual Inspection during the week ended this day.

P.S.—I may be permitted to mention, that during the Recess I have prepared a Pamphlet containing a full description of this Colony; with a Paper by the Statistician, E. C. Nowell, Esq., on Local Industries; together with a few practical Hints to Emigrants. Of this Pamphlet the Executive Government have caused 20,000 copies to be printed by Mr. Fletcher for £135; and I have availed myself of my office hours and leisure time to address (in order that they might be circulated throughout Great Britain and India) 14,900 of these Pamphlets to Members of the British Parliament; British and Indian Newspapers; and Clergymen of the Churches of England, Scotland, and Rome in Great Britain; a duty which has entailed a vast amount of work upon me, but which I trust will be attended with good results to the Colony, and a duty in which I have been greatly assisted by the Library Clerk (my son), who for four years past has attended in the Library at a small remuneration charged to the "Clerical Assistance" of the House of Assembly.
