

SPRING BAY OYSTER BEDS.

To the Honourable the House of Assembly of Tasmaina, in Parliament assembled.

The humble Petition of the undersigned Landholders and Householders within the Municipality of Spring Bay.

RESPECTFULLY SHOWETH:

THAT your Petitioners view with great concern the gradual destruction of the Spring Bay Oyster Beds. That they believe there are more Licences annually granted than the area of the Fishing grounds will bear without great injury. That the Municipal Council do not receive the amount of the Licences. That they have not the power of exercising any control over the Fishing grounds. That they believe, under the system now pursued, they will be totally annihilated, as they have been in other places. That they at present bring a large amount of money to the Colony. And they humbly submit that no parties can be so fit to control and superientend these Oyster Beds as those resident on the spot and immediately interested therein.

Your Petitioners therefore respectfully pray that your Honorable House will cause the management of these Oyster Beds to be vested in the Municipal Council of Spring Bay.
