



REVENUE.

Laid on the Table by the Colonial Treasurer, and ordered by the House to be printed, 4 September, 1867.



RETURN showing the Duties devolving upon the Local Marine Board at Torquay; the number of times the Board has sat; the Revenue derived from its operation; and the Expenses of working the Board.

The Local Marine Board at Torquay, River Mersey, has the power, under *The Marine Board Act*, to regulate the Pilot and Harbour Establishment of that Out-port, and otherwise to control the proceedings of the Habour Master and his Assistants, under the general control and approval of the Launceston Marine Board.

The Local Board directs the expenditure of the revenue collected at that Out-port in the erection of Wharfs, and the maintaining of Buoys and Beacons required: it grants exemption from Pilotage, Licences to Boatmen, and exercises supervision over the Port generally, and the Ferry established under authority of a Bye-Law of the Launceston Marine Board.

The Board has met thirty-four times since its first establishment; viz.—

The Board has not met for upwards of a year,—principally in consequence of the absence of a Chairman to the Board, and the removal of some of the members from the vicinity of the Port.

The accompanying Return, furnished by T. A. Murray, Esq., Police Magistrate at Torquay, will show names of the members who attended these meetings.

The Revenue consists of Wharfage-rates, Harbour-dues, Pilotage, Boatmen's Licences, and a few miscellaneous items, all of which, except Pilotage, are applied towards payment of the requirements of the Port, the erection of Beacons, and laying down Buoys at the entrance of the Port and of the adjoining rivers.

The working expenses of the Board have been confined lately to the occasional payment of a Clerk or Secretary. At its first establishment a Secretary was appointed at a salary of £25 a year; a Pilot and Harbour Master at £220 a year, and house; Assistant Pilot, £100 a year; and Boatman, £90 a year. The Boatman was dispensed with at the end of four months,—the Assistant Pilot then acting as Boatman.

At the end of 1862 the salary of the Pilot was discontinued; and since then his remuneration has been the Pilotage collected at the Port.

The Secretary's salary was reduced to £10 on the 1st April, 1860,—subsequently increased to £15,—and discontinued 31st December, 1863.

In March, 1865, the sum of £10 a year was again appropriated towards payment of a Clerk or Secretary: this was discontinued on 31st August, 1866.

The Local Board at the end of 1866 was indebted to the Launceston Marine Board in the sum of £178 8s. 5d., being that amount expended in erecting a Wharf at Torquay and other requirements of the Out-port, in excess of the amount collected there.
