



SIR,

I HAVE the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch, No. 24, of the 11th March, forwarding copy of a Resolution passed by the House of Assembly of Tasmania, objecting to the Transportation of Convicts to any settled portion of Australia.

I beg to inform you, that there is no intention of sending Convicts to any part of Australia, excepting only that Colony, situated at a great distance from all others, to which Convicts have already been sent for several years past.
