Repeal of Regulations Postponement Bill 2015

- The Subordinate Legislation Act 1992 provides for the systematic repeal of subordinate legislation over a rolling 10 year period. If regulations are to continue to have effect they must be remade in accordance with the requirements of the Subordinate Legislation Act, or have their expiration postponed.
- The Repeal of Regulations Postponement Bill 2015 seeks to postpone until 1 July 2017 the automatic repeal of the Retirement Benefits Regulations 2005.
- Each year for a variety of reasons, the Government may need to defer the repeal of regulations that fall due for automatic repeal under the Subordinate Legislation Act. This course of action, when necessary, is essential for the effective operation of government and the administration of legislation.
- Postponing the repeal of the Retirement Benefit Regulations will ensure their continuity and enable the Retirement Benefits Act 1993 to continue to operate effectively pending the finalisation of the Review of the Strategic Direction of the Retirement Benefits Fund.
- Nothing in this Bill prevents the Retirement Benefits Regulations being rescinded before I July 2017.
