



COMMISSIONER'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 1890.

Presented to both Houses of Parliament by His Excellency's Command.

I have the honor to submit my Annual Report upon the Police appointed for the several Municipalities within the Colony for the year 1890, in accordance with Section 7 of "The Police Regulation Act, 1865."

I visited the several Municipalities during the year, and inspected the offices and other police buildings at the head stations, as well as the books and records, and found them generally in good order, and it appeared to me the provisions of "The Police Regulation Act" were duly observed and carried into effect. I did not find it practicable to visit the whole of the out-stations.

The several Municipal Councils maintained a sufficient staff of Constables to meet the requirements of the 17th Section of the Act in the maintenance of order and the prevention and detection of crime.

I append the particulars of the Police Establishment of each Municipality in detail, and also attach the usual Returns relating to offenders.
