



That on the redistribution of Seats some time ago the Electorate Districts of Kingborough and Queenborough were amalgamated. The joining together of these two very large Districts has proved inconvenient and unsatisfactory to both the Electors and their Representatives.

Your Petitioners therefore pray that Kingborough may be separated from Queen-borough.

And your Petitioners, as in duty bound, will ever pray.
