



## ANNUAL REPORT, 1887.

Crown Lands Office, 4th June, 1888.

## Revenue.

The late Deputy Surveyor-General estimated the Revenue for the year ending 30th June, 1888, at £52,495, exclusive of survey fees. The amount received to the 31st May was £46,751; and as land sales are to be held at Hobart, Launceston, and Latrobe at the end of this month, the receipts will probably reach £51,000, if not the full amount estimated.

The amount received for the year 1887 was £53,604, being an increase of £1101 on the previous year.

#### Progress of Settlement.

The number of applications for land during 1887 was 1514; and during the five months of this year they number 627.

The area of country lands upon which deposits were paid in 1887 was 55,046 acres, as against 50,609 acres in 1886. In the County of Devon the area was 17,897 acres, and in the County of Dorset 10,719 acres. A reference to the tables will show that these areas were far in excess of those of the years 1885 and 1886. At the end of the year 1887 certain areas along the Scottsdale line of railway, which had been withdrawn, were thrown open for selection, and a large number of applications have been received, the surveys in connection with which are now being made. During the five months of this year deposits have been paid on 17,743 acres, of which 6295 acres were in the County of Devon and 3544 in Dorset.

#### Drafting Room.

The Chief Draftsman reports that a large amount of work has been performed during the past twelve months. New plans have been compiled of the Towns of Triabunna, Strahan, Derby, St. Mary's, Franklin, Carnarvon, Sorell, Colebrook Dale, Mangana, Bellerive, Ross, Hythe, and Chudleigh. New editions have been issued of Ulverstone and Formby, and plans are in course of preparation of Somerset, Richmond, Avoca, Swansea, and the suburbs of Launceston. Corrected editions have also been issued of the Counties of Wellington, Devon, Cornwall, and Buckingham. Plans have been required showing boundaries of Districts for Assessment purposes, Fruit Districts, and Rabbit Districts. The preparation of these, with the ordinary work of making tracings, &c. has kept the staff fully occupied.

During the year 1887, 1114 surveyors' plans were examined and checked, and during the five months of 1888, 307 plans.

The work of preparing Registers, showing the lands selected under the Waste Lands Act, has occupied a considerable portion of the time of two draftsmen, and, though not yet completed, the Public Works branch has been from time to time supplied with the necessary information for the distribution of the funds under that Act.

#### Lithography.

Both the Photo-Lithographer and Lithographer have been fully employed, and the style of work turned out has shown a great improvement upon that of previous years. A large amount of work has been done for the Defence Force, Board of Health, Post Office, Fisheries Department, Federal Council, Statistician, &c., in addition to that required by the Lands, Works, and Mines Departments in the ordinary course.

#### Examination for Land Surveyors.

In December, 1887, two candidates were examined, both of whom passed satisfactorily.

## Regulations for District Surveyors.

Some of the District Surveyors having represented that the scale of fees at present paid was not sufficiently large for the increased accuracy of the work required from them, and various suggestions having been made which did not prove satisfactory, it was decided that a conference of surveyors should be held for the purpose of considering whether, without sacrificing accuracy, the Regulations could be so amended that the work should prove more remunerative. To some extent the object of this conference will be attained; but it is not considered practicable to increase the emoluments of surveyors at the cost of the selector.

#### Miscellaneous.

I am glad to be able to report that the Chief Draftsman has completed, for the Registrar-General, the much needed work, the re-description of the boundaries of Registration Districts, three of the draftsmen having supplied him with the necessary maps.

Appended are tables showing the statistics of the Crown Lands Department since the year 1881.
