

EDUCATION DEPARTMENT.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor in Council under "The Education Act, 1885."

[20th September, 1887.]

ADDITIONAL ASSISTANT TEACHERS.

75. Assistant Teachers, other than those mentioned in Section 59, may be appointed in large Schools; but no such assistant shall be appointed who has not passed satisfactorily the final examination for Pupil Teachers, or some equivalent examination.

76. The ordinary provision of Assistants shall be at the rate of one for every four Pupil Teachers employed; but this proportion may be increased at the discretion of the Minister.

77. In estimating the Teaching Staff required for a School, two Assistants shall be regarded as equal to three Pupil Teachers.

78. The Salaries of Assistants shall be those of Male and Female Teachers in the several divisions of the Probationary Classes. The salary will begin at the lowest rate in each division, except in the case of Certificated Teachers, and promotion from one grade to another will be dependent upon reports of good conduct, and of proved efficiency in teaching and management.

[10th October, 1887.] NIGHT SCHOOLS.

79. A State Night School may be established by the Minister of Education in any locality, under a duly qualified teacher, on the application of parents or other residents, and with the recommendation of the Board of Advice; but no such school shall be held in a building which is not under the control of the Minister.

80. For the establishment and continuance of a Night School a regular attendance of not less than ten scholars above the age of 12 years will be required, and the time devoted to instruction must not be less than six hours per week.

81. The fees payable in Night Schools shall be at the rate of 9d. per week for each scholar.

82. Payment will be made by the Minister for the instruction of night scholars at the rate of 6d. per week for each scholar.

83. A free grant of books and other requisites will be made by the Minister on the first establishment of a Night School.

TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

84. The Governor in Council may from time to time appoint such Local Technical Committees, not exceeding five in number, as he may deem fit.

TEACHING OF PRINCIPLES OF TECHNICAL EDUCATION.

22. (b.) In addition to the Committee of Five appointed under Regulation 22 to aid the Minister, the Governor in Council may appoint a Local Committee, not exceeding Five in number, for the management of any Technical School subject to the control of the Minister.

ASSISTANTS' PERCENTAGE OF SCHOOL FEES.

59. (b.) The percentage of School Fees payable to Assistants in State Schools shall be calculated upon the gross amount of the Fees certified to have been received by the Teacher during the previous year. Where two or more Assistants are employed, a fixed proportion of such percentage may be allotted by the Minister to the chief Assistant, and the balance divided among the other Assistants in such proportions as the Minister may determine.
