



PARLIAMENT OF TASMANIA.

I have the honor to submit to you the Annual Report on this Department for the year ending 31st December, 1894.

In the general depression, which has more or less affected all classes of business in the community, it was of course impossible for this Office to escape suffering to some extent, although until last year the decrease in business might fairly well have been considered as nothing more than would have arisen from ordinary fluctuations. The year just ended was, however, not so satisfactory on this point, and this is not to be wondered at when one remembers the great difficulty which has existed in realising on property at satisfactory prices. To meet this state of affairs, additional retrenchment was carried out last year, and further reductions in expenditure came into force this year.

In illustration, allow me to draw your attention to the following figures showing the amounts borne on the Estimates for the Department for five consecutive years, commencing with 1891, when the depression first set in:—

It will be seen, therefore, that the expenditure provided for the current year is £502 (1/6th) less than that provided for 1891. When it is taken into consideration that the Solicitor to the Department now also acts as Parliamentary Draftsman, it may fairly be claimed that the saving effected is considerable. Notwithstanding the unfavourable state of the property market, the receipts for the year are slightly in excess of the true and actual cost proper of working the Department, although the amount standing to its debit in the Treasury Accounts is in excess of the receipts, owing to certain expenditure unconnected with its working, and which will not occur again, having for convenience' sake remained charged to it for the year.

The following table shows the principal transactions for the year, and a more detailed table of all transactions is subjoined in the usual form :—

289 searches were made, not including those effected by the Department for the Crown Law Office and the Income Tax Department.

The Lands' Titles Commissioners have held 40 sittings, and dealt with 131 applications of all kinds, many of them affecting properties of considerable value, one of which alone was declared at £45,000.

The Assurance Fund now amounts to £10,423 10s. 9d.; no one, however, can say when a claim upon it may arise, and the proportion which it bears even to the value of the land annually brought under "The Real Property Act," or indeed to some of the properties (see last paragraph), is still small, showing that this Fund requires careful nursing for many years to come, not only for its own sake but also for the confidence which its existence inspires in the public for the Torrens' system.

The town and country lithographic plans supplied to this Office from the Survey Department have now all been coloured to show the lands under "The Torrens' Act." Compilations of Hobart and the Town of Queenborough giving similar information have been recently completed and are being lithographed for distribution. I expect to find ready purchasers for these among the legal profession and those doing business with the Department. This work has been performed at intervals as occasion served, and now that it is completed will prove of great value in searching and otherwise facilitating the working of the system. It has involved a considerable amount of labour, and reflects credit on the Drafting Staff.

The Long Room has been enlarged by the removal of a partition, and now holds all the clerical staff, who were previously dispersed in three rooms. This will greatly assist supervision and the passing on of the work from one stage to another, and will thus conduce to improve administration coupled with some economy.

I have as usual to acknowledge the courteous co-operation which the Legal Profession have extended to me in the administration of "The Real Property Act."
