



SIR

THE Statements of Accounts exhibiting the transactions of the Consolidated Revenue for the year 1894 were received from the Treasury on the 1st May, and after being duly audited, were certified to and returned on the 30th May. In accordance with the provisions of "The Audit Act" I have now the honour to forward my Report thereon.

REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE.

Revenue proper.—The Revenue for the year 1894, as compared with that of the year 1893, shows an aggregate decrease of £7845 16s. 7d., there being a falling off under each head of Revenue, with the exception of that of Land Tax, the rate of which had been increased during last Session of Parliament, and of that of Income Tax, which was a new source of Revenue. The total Receipts for 1894 were £696,795 9s. 8d., as compared with £704,641 6s. 3d. for 1893. The following table shows the particulars:—

Included in the figures £14,958 8s. 1d., Interest on Public Accounts, &c. for 1894, is an amount of £3542 2s. 2d. for interest due, but not yet paid by the liquidators of the Bank of Van Diemen's Land, The aggregate amount due by the liquidators for interest to the end of the year 1894 and taken to account as revenue was £12,391 6s. 4d. This sum is included in the item "Bank V. D. Land, in liquidation. Dr. £74,384 5s. 5d," shown in the Treasurer's Balance Sheet.

The amount credited to the Miscellaneous Revenue for 1894 includes a sum of £697 2s. 11d. transferred from the Stock Act Fund, but it is required by Section 15 of "The Stock Act," 39 Vict. No. 20, that the moneys in this Fund shall be applied under Parliamentary approval. The Honorable the Treasurer has promised that a Bill will be prepared for the purpose of giving legal effect to this transfer.

Expenditure.—The Expenditure for the year 1894 amounted to £789,805 10s., being £93,010 0s. 4d. in excess of the Revenue, and increasing the accumulated Revenue deficiency to £455,127 17s. 1d. as at the end of the year 1894. There were, however, large collections on account of Land Tax and Income Tax in arrear at the close of the year. Of these there have been received up to the end of May in this year about £16,000 on account of Land Tax, and £19,000 on account of Income Tax. The following shows the position of the Consolidated Revenue Account at the end of 1894:—

Treasury Bills in aid of Revenue.—The whole of the Treasury Bills to the amount of £404,800 authorised, and referred to in last year's Report, have been issued; but of these, Bills to the value of £40,000 matured during 1894, leaving the amount of £364,800 outstanding at the end of the year, as shown by the Treasurer's Balance Sheet. During the current year Bills to the value of £109,800 have also matured, the balance outstanding at the date of this Report being thus £255,000. The renewal of the £149,800, for which Treasury Bills fell in during 1894 and 1895, has been provided for in Act 58 Vict.

EXPENDITURE REQUIRING PARLIAMENTARY PROVISION.

A Return is annexed of Expenditure authorised by the Governor in Council on account of the year 1894 under Regulation 19 of the Audit Act, £8199 6s. 3d. being for excess expenditure over the 1894 votes or for new expenditure, and £614 10s. 11d. for lapsed votes or arrears of expenditure of former years.—(See Appendix A). A Return is also annexed of amounts standing to the debit of certain accounts on the 31st December, 1894, and which require to be dealt with under Parliamentary sanction, or by transfer to authorised heads of expenditure.—(See Appendix B).

UNEXPENDED CREDITS ON VOTES.

There are several credits on votes which do not appear to be now required for the purposes for which the votes were originally made, or which have arisen from other causes. It seems desirable that the Treasury Accounts should be cleared of these. Particulars are shown in Appendix C.

DEBT OF THE COLONY.

The permanent Debt of the Colony, as shown in the Treasurer's Balance Sheet, amounted on 31st December, 1894, to £7,726,464 3s. 8d., but this amount includes the sum of £312,119 10s. 1d. added a second time by the inclusion in the Debt of the Million Loan floated during 1894, and which sum is available for the redemption of Treasury Bills maturing during the year 1895; if this be deducted the net indebtedness would be £7,414,344 13s. 7d., as shown in the following Table:—

Since the close of the year 1894 the £750,000 Loan authorised under Act 58 Vict. No. 40 has been floated. This includes £75,674 13s. 7d. to redeem Treasury Bills falling due during 1895 and 1896, and £305,600 to redeem Debentures maturing in 1895, 1896, and 1897. If these two amounts be deducted from the £750,000, the additional amount to add will be £368,725 6s. 5d.; but Waste Lands Act Debentures to the amount of £300 matured on the 1st January last. The net indebtedness of the Colony at the date of this Report therefore will be, after allowing for amounts for the redemption of Debentures and Treasury Bills, £7,782,770. The Treasury Bills for £255,000 raised in aid of Revenue are not included in these figures.

TRUST FUNDS MANAGED BY THE GOVERNMENT.

The total amount paid by the Treasury for Pensions during the year was £11,761 2s. 11d., of which £11,000 had been advanced by the Sinking Fund as shown above, leaving a balance of £761 2s. 11d. to be paid by the Fund to adjust accounts. The receipts of the Fund for the year 1894 amounted to £25,658 15s. 11d., making an aggregate sum since the establishment of the Fund in November, 1881, of £336,780 14s. 2d., the aggregate payments having been for redemption of Debentures £203,180, and for payments of Pensions £22,637 16s. 1d., or a total of £225,817 16s. 1d., and leaving a balance of £110,962 18s. 1d. as already shown.

The Real Property Act requires that the accumulations of this Fund shall be invested in Government securities, but a portion has been placed at fixed deposit, it being pointed out that no Government securities were available at the time. It appears desirable that the Act should be amended so as to meet such a contingency.

Post Office Savings Bank.—The accumulated deposits of this Bank at the end of 1894 reached £99,365 5s. 3d. (or close on £100,000), an increase on the amount at the end of 1893 of £8302 1s. 7d. The usual particulars are appended:—

The total assets of the Bank were £101,948 17s. 5d., of which £91,200 had been invested in Government securities, £9226 16s. 5d. remained in the Treasury, and £1522 1s. 0d. had accrued for interest on investments. Of the total amount, £99,365 5s. 3d. stood to the credit of depositors, as shown above, £2125 15s. 7d. was due to the Money Order Account, the balance, £457 16s. 7d., representing the profit which had accrued on the year's transactions, and which profit has been transferred to the Consolidated Revenue according to the usual practice. Of the £9226 16s. 5d. remaining uninvested at the end of the year, £7000 has since been placed at fixed deposit. It is required by Section 13 of "The Post Office Act," 45 Vict. No. 13, that all investments shall be made in Debentures, Treasury Bills, or other Government securities, and the placing of money at fixed deposit was questioned. It was explained that there were no Government securities available; and it has been requested that an amendment of the Act be sought, in a similar way to that above suggested in connection with investments of moneys of the Real Property Act Assurance Fund.

Post Office Money Order Account.—This account has been adjusted to the 31st December, 1894, to a closer figure than it has formerly been found possible to adjust it, there being an unexplained credit balance of £1 13s. 7d. When the large number and complicated nature of the transactions is considered—the Savings Bank System and the Postal Note System being worked also through this Account—and adjustments requiring to be made with the various Colonies, as well as with England and foreign countries, the result is highly satisfactory. The amount of balance, £1 13s. 7d., together with £37 19s. 10d. which had accrued for void orders, following the usual custom, have been paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

Mount Cameron Water-race Fund.—The account for maintenance and management of this Fund under Act 51 Vict. No. 28 for the year 1894 has been examined and passed. The particulars of the account are as follows :-

This Provident Fund has now been established for 13 years, and the balance to the credit of the Superannuation Branch represents an increase of 48.4 per cent. upon the total deductions made from the pay of those members now in the Force and upon the books of the Branch. An authority of the Governor in Council was issued in March, 1894, suspending the deductions from pay and consequent payment of such deductions to the Provident Fund. No additions to the Superannuation Branch from this source have therefore been made since 1893. The payments to the Reward Branch of the moiety of fines and penalties provided for under Section 9 of "The Police Regulation Amendment Act, 1881," 45 Vict. No.21, have also been suspended during the same period. Questions have been raised as to the sufficiency of the authorities for the suspension of these payments, and they are now under the consideration of the Law Department.

Fox and Dewler Bequests.—These accounts to 31st December, 1894, were received from the Chief Secretary's Department, examined and found correct. The capital, £447 4s. 11d. of the Dexter Bequest, was placed at Fixed Deposit, and the interest received to 31st December, 1894, £22 16s. 1d., had been distributed to the Boys' Home, Hobart; the Girls' Industrial School, Hobart; and the Girls' Industrial School, Launceston. Of the capital—£800—of the Fox Bequest there was placed at Fixed Deposit £300, and invested in Treasury Bills £500; the interest received during during the year, £37 16s. 7d., having been distributed to Boarded-out Children; St. Joseph's Orphanage, Hobart; the Boys' Home, Hobart; the Girls' Industrial School, Launceston.

The Sorell Municipal Accounts were specially inspected on 31st October last. The balance of collections, £60 0s. 1d., was found to be unbanked, but only £20 18s. 2d. was found in the custody of the Council Clerk, who was absent from his office through illness, the deficiency being £39 1s. 11d. A report on the matter was referred to the Warden, and the balance afterwards brought to account.

The Upper Sorell Road Trust Accounts were examined on the 1st November last, the Sorell Council Clerk being the Secretary of this Trust. A deficiency of cash amounting to £14 9s. 9d. was discovered, this amount having been collected more than six months previously. This was brought under the notice of the Chairman, and the cash was subsequently accounted for.

The Sorell Main Road Accounts were inspected also on the 1st November last. A sum of £4 deposited with tender was not found on hand. This was reported to the Chairman, and the Secretary, who is also the Council Clerk, stated that he was instructed to retain the amount against rates payable, the balance to be returned to tenderer. The Secretary pointed out that he was liable also for £7 received as a deposit on another tender.

The Gordon Road Trust Accounts were inspected on the 18th October last, and an amount of £30 7s. 6d. was found to be unaccounted for by the Treasurer, who is also Chairman, and who admitted having used the money for his private purposes. Some difficulty was experienced in obtaining a final adjustment of the deficiency, and further trouble has been caused by the Chairman in the settling of the annual accounts. This is the second time the Treasurer's cash has been found deficient, he having last year promised amendment in this respect.

The Gordon Fruit Board Accounts, examined on the 19th October last, disclosed a cash deficiency of £8 18s. $1\frac{1}{2}d$., this amount having been collected some years since. The Chairman, who was responsible for the amount, and who is also the Chairman of the Road Trust, subsequently paid the amount to the bank, but after a settlement had been repeatedly applied for.

The Gould's Country Road Trust Accounts were inspected in December last, and irregularities in the books of the Secretary and Collector discovered. The official who held these combined positions had disappeared, and a Rate Book was missing. He, however, afterwards returned, produced the Rate Book, and assisted to adjust the accounts. There was a deficiency of about £40, which was subsequently brought to account, and the Secretary resigned.

Large arrears of rates were shown on the books of many of the Road Trusts, the explanation in most cases given being the prevailing depression of the times.

Launceston Municipality.—Under an arrangement with the Government, the accounts of this Municipality are now being examined by the Audit Department, and the Auditor-General has been appointed a Commissioner of the Sinking Fund under "The Town of Launceston Loans Consolidation Act, 1886." During the inspection of accounts it came under notice that there is a balance amounting at 31st December last to £8905 6s. 6d. to the credit of a "Waterworks Sinking Fund" which was not taken into account when the Loans Consolidation Act of 1886 was passed; the amount, therefore, requires appropriating, and it appears desirable that it should be paid into the Sinking Fund under the last-mentioned Act. Section 80 of "The Launceston Water and Light Act, 1895," passed last Session, provides for an "Electric Light Sinking Fund," which is to be applied from time to time to the redemption of mortgages and the restoration and improvement of works and machinery. It seems necessary that this Section should be amended so as to provide for a "Sinking Fund" for redemptions, and a "Reserve Fund" for restoration and improvement purposes, as it is obvious that the Fund might be used entirely for works, and leave nothing towards redemption of mortgages.

Hobart Municipality.—This Municipality has not consented to the governmental audit of accounts for the present, but have granted the right of inspection of books and accounts for the purpose of obtaining any information required. This permission has been availed of. The Auditor-General, in his capacity as

one of the Commissioners of the Hobart Corporation Sinking Fund, established under Act 43 Vict. No. 22, has brought under notice the utter inadequacy of the provision now made by the Hobart Municipality to form Sinking Funds required by law for the redemption of the several loans raised, and the question has been referred to the Municipal Council. The sum of £600 per annum is now paid from the Municipal Fund to the Sinking Fund; but, assuming that interest on investments continuously made were effected at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum, an approximate amount of £2200 per annum should be set aside yearly to meet the legal engagements of the Corporation in connection with the redemption of their loans. The Honorable the Treasurer has advanced the sum of £4750 at interest to the Hobart Corporation for the purpose of enabling them to pay the half-yearly interest due during May, 1895, on loans in England. The Government have guaranteed the payment of the interest under statutory authority, hence the reference here to the provision made to meet loans and interest. The Honorable the Treasurer's attention has been called to the fact that the Hobart Corporation paid £9230 15s. out of unexpended loans balances in their hands to meet interest on loans accruing due in 1894, the transaction being taken exception to by the Corporation auditors when attaching their certificate to the annual accounts.

The calculations made with regard to the amount payable to the Sinking Funds, both at Hobart and Launceston, have been based upon the assumption that the debentures issued will have a currency of fifty years. The Loans Consolidation Acts of both Municipalities, however, require amendment to make this certain, as some of the provisions in the respective Acts regulating this matter appear inconsistent with each other.

Grants-in-Aid to Road Trusts and Town Boards.—The Road Trusts entitled to grants-in-aid under Act 58 Vict. No. 26 number 28, the amounts due to these being £2909 11s. 3d. The Town Boards entitled number 6, and the amount due is £925 4s. 2d.—or a total amount payable under the Act of £3834 15s. 5d.

Southport Village Settlement.—The scheme of this Settlement having been approved by the Governor in Council, in accordance with the provisions of Act 58 Vict. No. 24, the accounts were submitted for examination, and a claim for £454 10s. passed in accordance with the terms of the Act. The complete accounts to June 1st, 1895, have since been audited by this Department. Exclusive of the subsidy of £454 10s., the receipts in connection with the Settlement have been £356 15s. 11d., and the expenditure £318 6s. 2d., leaving a balance in hand of £38 9s. 9d.

With the exception of £2600 of the moneys in the Marine Board, Launceston, Sinking Fund, the whole of the investments are made in Fixed Deposits. As the Act requires the amounts to be invested in Government Stock, an amendment appears necessary in the direction indicated with regard to the Assurance Fund under the Real Property Act and the Post Office Savings Bank Account. The Sinking Fund in connection with the Campbell Town Water Trust Loan has not hitherto been managed by the Treasury: this, however, will probably be dealt with by the Treasury in future.

Of the £10,000 raised under Loans Act, 56 Vict. No. 53, for the Latrobe Water Trust, only £8000 has been drawn, and £200 has this year been returned by that Trust to the Treasury, thus leaving £2200 balance on the Treasury books. In addition to this amount, £3000 was raised for the Glenorchy Water Trust in excess of the amount required, and £400 of the remainder has not been drawn by this Trust. There is thus a total balance of £5600 on hand of this Loan which requires to be dealt with under Parmentary sanction if no portion of the amount is available for the purposes for which it was raised.

The Glenorchy Water Trust owed £569 18s. 4d. for interest to the Treasury at the end of the year, since when the sum of £300 has been paid on account, leaving £269 18s. due to 1st January last. The amount paid in has been credited to the Consolidated Revenue, leaving nothing to credit to the Sinking Fund from this payment.

INSPECTION OF ACCOUNTS.

During the year 1894 the Officers of the Department acting as Travelling Inspectors have examined 142 accounts of Departments, 82 of Local Post Offices, and 176 of Public Bodies, or 400 in all. Some irregularities discovered during these inspections are referred to under the heading "Public Bodies." Much of the local inspection work is now in arrear, owing to pressure of office duties, but it is hoped this will soon be overtaken.

THE GOVERNMENT STOREKEEPER'S ACCOUNTS.

These were received, made up to the 30th June, 1894, on the 7th September last, and were specially reported upon to the Treasury on the 18th of the same month. The accounts were rendered promptly, and found in good order.

The Storekeeper's Department has since been abolished, the stock on hand being distributed partly to Government Institutions and Departments, partly in suspense accounts to the Defence Department and Government Printing Department, and the remainder sold or written off, with the exception of a few articles which are now in process of disposal. The issues to Departments, &c. have been charged to 1894 and 1895 votes. As a large quantity of stores was not worth the value originally placed upon the books much of this was written down, and a loss on the nominal values arose also upon sales, with the result that an approximate amount of £2500 will be required to be voted to cover loss on sales and depreciation. The saving effected upon salaries, &c. due to the closing of the Stores Department amounts to about £630 per annum, and an additional saving of at least £500 per annum will accrue in interest on stock formerly kept continuously on hand and not now held under other suspense accounts. Combining these savings with those due to new methods of purchase now in operation, and to economy in use of stores, stationery, &c., under the supervision of the Inspector of Stores, the total should exceed £2000 per annum.

NEW DUTIES UNDERTAKEN.

Stores Accounts.—The Storekeeper, under the new title of Secretary of the Board of Tenders and Inspector of Stores, together with two Stores Clerks, have been transferred to the Audit Department. Although placed on the Audit Estimates, the Secretary of the Board of Tenders take his instructions from that Board and from the Minister, and arranges for the supply and distribution of all stores to the various Departments, but as Inspector of Stores, the duty of passing accounts for stores, checking Government advertisements with newspapers, inspecting and reporting upon stores supplies in all Offices and Institutions, examining ration and fuel and light returns, keeping records of stores supplied and accounts passed, and all incidental work connected with supplies of stores, is undertaken under the control of the Auditor-General. The two clerks transferred assist in this work, and they are available also for all ordinary audit duties. The work in connection with the breaking up of the Stores Department has occupied a large portion of the time of the officers now transferred, during the current year, and, to quote from a Report furnished to me by the Inspector of Stores, that officer has not had a fair opportunity of proving whether his attachment to the Audit Department has been fully justified, or that the benefit of his services has been of practical value. A number of economies have been effected in purchase of stores, but as these may be due

partly to the depressed state of the times and to relatively low prices, the Inspector refers to savings made at his instance as Secretary of the Tender Board upon requisitions received during the early part of this year, the total saving having been £246 19s. 7d.

Income Tax.—The Chief Clerk of this Department having been sworn in as "Auditor" under "The Income Tax Act," and the Auditor-General as a Member of the "Board of Advice," the Income Tax collections are subject to audit, and several questions have been raised thereon, but owing to pressure of other work and the late closing of the Income Tax Rolls, the accounts have not yet been completely

Other Duties.—The audit of Corporation Accounts has been elsewhere referred to. The Accounts of the General Hospitals at Hobart and Launceston, although transferred to the control of the respective Boards of Management, and those of the Launceston Charitable Institution, transferred to the Launceston Benevolent Society, are still subject to examination by the Audit Department. The examination of the Southport Village Settlement Accounts has been already referred to.

QUERIES, LETTERS, &C. NOT SATISFIED.

The following letter was addressed to me by Mr. Lovett upon his retirement from the office of Auditor-General:

Audit Department, Hobart, 31st December, 1894.

THERE are certain unsatisfied questions, &c. remaining, before the termination of my position as Auditor-General, of a special nature mentioned hereafter, which it is desirable should be brought under your notice by me now that you have been appointed as my successor, in order that the responsibility of the inclusion thereof in your Report to Parliament may rest upon the right shoulders; this letter is therefore written with that object in view.

1. An advance of £500 was made by the Government to the Strahan Marine Board in February, 1893, as a loan, to bear interest at the rate of 5 per cent. per annum, and the amount was entered to "Suspense Account" upon the understanding and promise that the Treasurer would submit the matter to Parliament at the following Session for consideration as to the manner in which the account should be finally adjusted; but, as the Session of Parliament had passed, and the promise had not been fulfilled; also as the interest had not been paid, information was sought as to the intentions of the Government in respect to both matters, by letter, on 20th September last, when the Treasurer replied:—"I have had this matter under correspondence with the Board in question, and fear that the £500 must remain in suspense for some time; but as to the interest, I am watching the accounts of the Board, and hope to keep this paid regularly: Interest has subsequently been paid to 31st December, 1893, but no arrangement appears to have been entered into with regard to the adjustment of the loan.

2. Two cases have recently been noticed, and objection taken by this Department in respect thereof, on the grounds that the Treasurer had acted contrary to legal provision, to which the Minister in effect stated that he had decided in these cases upon his own responsibility in order to remove restrictions upon trade. In one, (a) Customs Warrant, No. 1178, September, 1894, an importation of traveller's samples, valued at £101 is., duty £20 4s. 3d. was allowed to pass upon a deposit being left in the hands of the Chief Clerk of the Hobert Customs, to be repaid to the importer when the goods should be re-exported instead of the money being paid into the revenue; in the other, (b) Launceston, Customs Warrant, No. 401, August, 1894, 8 packages, containing 250 wire coops, not valued, were allowed to pass free of duty, although liable thereto

seems to me very undestrable that the Government should sanction such distinct breaches of the law, as this must have a very injurious moral effect upon importers and others, it is hoped that the objections raised will be carefully considered, and prevent future cases being similarly dealt with.

3. By returns recently furnished under arrangement with the Lands Department, it appears that the overdue instalments on purchases of Crown Lands amounted to £47,686 on 30th June last, and the arrears of rent of Pastoral Leases and Occupation Licences to £5650 at the same date. It is understood, however, that the Government are taking action in regard to the same, but, as the fact of similar arrears having been previously brought under notice without any very large reduction thereof having been obtained, it is very desirable that the position of these amounts at the latest possible date should be brought under the notice of Parliament Parliament.

Parliament.

4. On the 24th August last the amount due by the Mount Dundas and Zeehan Railway Company to the Government—£2535 13s. 5d.—was brought under the notice of the General Manager of the Tasmanian Government Railways, and information sought as to any arrangement made for adjustment of the account, to which a reply has been received that the matter had been arranged by the Ministerial Head of the Railway Department. No particulars have, however, been given, nor has any payment to the Revenue yet been made; the matter should therefore be re-opened by early enquiry, and the position noticed in the next annual Report.

5. The examination of the Mount Dundas and Zeehan Railway Construction accounts was finally completed on the 5th instant, and after a considerable amount of correspondence with the Company I was enabled to

The examination of the Mount Dundas and Zeehan Railway Construction accounts was finally completed on the 5th instant, and after a considerable amount of correspondence with the Company I was enabled to pass the sum of £56,581 10s. 11d. as properly chargeable to construction account, out of a total expenditure claimed by the Company of £60,251 3s. 6d., the amount of the items objected to being £3669 12s. 7d.
 Rent of Powder and other explosives in Magazines.—On the occasion of a recent withdrawal at Hobart of a large quantity of gunpowder it was discovered that a considerable portion thereof had been stored for nearly three years, and that no rent had been collected on the same in the meanwhile in consequence of the regulations made under Act 39 Vict. No. 8, ss. 17 and 18, allowing powder, &c. to be stored for five years before the payment of rent can be legally demanded. It seems very desirable that the law should be altered in such a manner as to enable the keepers of the magazines to collect such rent at shorter periods.
 The desirability of Public Officers in situations of trust being required to give security as prescribed in Section 16 of Schedule 2 of the Audit Act should again be brought under the notice of the Government as soon as may be.

Yours faithfully, W. LOVETT. The following remarks are made upon the subjects referred to in Mr. Lovett's letter:-

- 1. Loan £500 to Strahan Marine Board.—The interest upon this Loan has been paid up to 31st December, 1894, but, as the Loan itself was made without legislative sanction, the necessary parliamentary approval should be obtained to dispose of this matter.
- 2. (a.) Deposits in lieu of Customs Duty on importation of Travellers' samples.—A large number of importations of Travellers' samples, in addition to that mentioned, have taken place and landed under the deposit system authorised by the Honorable the Treasurer. The particulars since September last, and to the end of May, 1895, are:—

(b.) Wire Coops passed free under guarantee of reshipment.—Under the Hon. the Treasurer's authority, an importation of 134 pkgs. poultry coops were similarly passed in free, the importer being a Mr. Johnson, Hobart; the particulars being shown on Hobart Customs Warrant, No. 1256, September, 1894.

The objection taken to the Hon. the Treasurer's action with regard to Travellers' samples is based, in the first place, upon the fact that it is contrary to the requirements of "The Customs Act," and, in the next place, to the obvious risk run in so much money being retained in the hands of the Customs officers, it being pointed out that these deposits are not even banked. The Audit Department, as the Hon. the Treasurer was reminded, had shortly before made arrangements for the payment of the deposits on sight entries to the Treasury, and thus avoided the risk of loss and inconvenience of watching cash kept on hand at the Custom House. The course required by the law appears the safer one, namely, the payment of duty on importation, and the allowance of drawback on exportation under "The Drawbacks Act."

In such cases as that of the free importation of coops under a guarantee, not only is this contrary to law, but there is much danger of loss to the Revenue, as in many cases it might be difficult to trace the importation, and upon a sale in the colony, even if known, the amount might not be recovered. Were the duty paid there would be no risk, and the drawback allowed could be made on exportation under "The Drawbacks Act."

In addition to the above-mentioned cases, the following were admitted under authority of the Honorable the Treasurer:—

Hobart Customs Warrant No. 1183, December, 1894.—3 open cars and 5 loads of old timber, valued at £25, admitted free under authority dated 18th December, 1894. These cars and timber formed a switchback railway, and upon the Treasurer's authority being queried, he replied to the effect that it was his opinion that it was not the intention of Parliament to charge duty on such importations. The railway, however, was subsequently sold, and £3 9s. duty paid in upon a valuation of £17 5s.

Hobart Customs Warrant, No. 1235, January, 1895.—One four-wheeled buggy passed free of duty as a "household effect," by authority dated 21st January, 1895. This was questioned upon the ground that carriages were rated under the tariff, the duty payable in this case being £12, the "Drawbacks Act" not even allowing a drawback on carriages except in the case of a visitor reshipping within six months.

Photographs imported through the Post Office.—Under an authority dated 11th January, 1895, the Post Office discontinued to collect duty on photographs imported by private persons and "not for sale," and upon a query being raised the Hon. the Treasurer contended that these photographs had no "commercial value;" but a reference was given to Section 7 of "The Customs Duties Act, 1894," 58 Vict. No. 4, which provides that the value of goods liable to ad valorem duty shall be understood to be "the fair market value thereof in the principal markets of the country whence the same were last exported," and the Inspector of Customs endorsed the Auditor-General's opinion, that the practice is to determine this value by accepting invoices showing the price paid for goods less any trade discount. The Hon. the Treasurer submitted cases to the Hon. the Attorney-General, who concurred with the Treasurer principally upon the ground that "if a commercial value were put upon such photographs it would necessarily be so low that the duty would not be worth the trouble and expense of collecting it;" but it has been pointed out to the Hon. the Treasurer that in the cases submitted by him the value of the importation would rarely exceed 5s., and in such cases they are already admitted free under the tariff, and that it is unnecessary in most cases to fix the value as that is usually declared to elsewhere or shown on invoice; so the Attorney-General's decision does not apply to the cases questioned.

Treasurer's Authority, 25th April, 1895.—Lottery Apparatus, valued at £100—Entered upon payment of a deposit.

Treasurer's Authority, 9th May, 1895.—Lantern Slides and Limelight Appliances to be used at Lectures—Admitted free, and to be re-exported.

These questions, affecting the collection of Customs duty, have been dealt with at some length, with the hope that they may be carefully considered, as it will be the duty of the Auditor-General to continue to query all authorities which appear to be issued contrary to the intention of Parliament.

- 3. Instalments and Rent on Crown Lands.—It has been arranged with the Secretary for Lands that complete lists of overdue instalments on purchase of Crown Lands, and of arrears of rent of Pastoral Leases and Occupation Licences shall be prepared at the end of each year and be submitted for examination by the Audit Department. To bring this into operation, although lists had been furnished to 30th June last, as referred to in Mr. Lovett's letter, fresh lists were prepared by the Lands Department made up to 31st December, 1894. The amounts due as shown by these returns were—for overdue instalments on purchases, approximately, £57,000; and for arrears of Pastoral Leases and Occupation Licences, about £2000; or a total of £59,000. This amount has since been reduced by default sales, cancellations, and payments since made, to an approximate amount of £38,000.
- 4. Amount due by the Mount Dundas and Zeehan Railway Company.—The amount due, £2535 13s. 5d., on 24th August last, as shown by Mr. Lovett's letter, had increased on 31st August to £2988 4s. 2d. No information has yet been received as to the modified arrangement made by the Hon. the Minister of Lands and Works under Act 58 Vict. No. 18.
- 5. Mount Dundas and Zeehan Railway Construction Accounts.—It is noted for future information that the amount passed under the provisions of Section 5 of the Act 54 Vict. No. 54 as the cost of construction of the railway was £56,581 10s. 11d.
- 6. Rent of Powder, &c. in Magazines.—It is hoped that an amendment of "The Gunpowder Act" will be made to enable collection of rent, say at least once a year. The Law Officers of the Crown advise that regulations to effect this cannot be made unless by an amendment of the law.
- 7. Security by Public Officers.—Since the end of the year the provisions of Regulation 16 under "The Audit Act" have been carried out to the extent that a large number of public officers who collect public moneys have been assured with the United Australian Mutual Insurance Company of Victoria, the aggregate amount secured being £26,415, the premiums, which have been paid by the Government, amounting to £99 1s. 1d. There are, however, many collectors in Departments under the Honourable the Attorney-General, in the Railway, and other Departments requiring to be guaranteed. A letter on this subject was addressed to the Hon. the Treasurer on 26th April last.

OTHER QUERIES, &c.

Query 149, 16th May, 1892, raising a question as to whether Dividend Duty is not payable by certain shipping companies. This long-outstanding query, it is understood, is in the hands of the Law Officers.

Query 236, 5th September, 1894, drawing attention to the non-payment of Duty under the Real and Personal Estates Duties Act by Messrs. J. H. Geddes and Co., the Pastoral and Finance Association, Limited.

Query 238, 6th September, 1894, raising a similar question with regard to the Singer Manufacturing Company.

Letter to the Honourable the Minister of Lands and Works, 26th February, 1895, requesting balance of vouchers to discharge advances of £400 made on 20th January, 1892, and £40 10s. 11d. on 23rd December, 1892, to the Latrobe Chamber of Commerce to meet cost of works in connecting Latrobe Wharf. Vouchers for £193 17s. 3d. were submitted and passed on the 7th July, 1893, and repeated applications were made for the remainder of the vouchers. These were received in November last only, but were not in a satisfactory state, and they were returned for completion. Continued applications have since been made by the Public Works Department for their return, but these have not been attended to; the expenditure beyond the £193 17s. 3d. dealt with in 1893 therefore has not yet been passed.

Memorandum to the Honourable the Treasurer, 15th January, 1895, upon payment of the sum of £227 14s. 10d. to the Treasury by the Curator of Intestate Estates. Attention was drawn to the difficult position the Auditor-General is placed in by being required to accept as correct payments made to the Treasury without an opportunity being afforded him of verifying the same. This question has been referred to for years in the Auditor's Annual Reports, and in the Session of 1887 a Resolution was passed by both Houses of Parliament expressing the opinion of the Houses that the Curator's accounts should be audited by the Auditor in the same manner as are all other public accounts. This Resolution has never been given effect to, and reference is once more made in the hope that a finality will be reached either by an amendment of the Intestate Estates Act, in order to bring the accounts under the examination of the Audit Department, or by some other distinct expression of the wishes of Parliament.—(See Appendix D.)

Query 253, 2nd March, 1895, with respect to an advance of £35 made by the Agent-General to pay Mr. R. B. Packer's passage to the Colony.—(See Appendix E.)

Letter to the Honourable the Attorney-General, 26th April, 1895.—Referring to an authority surrendering the control of the contingent votes to the Departments under the Honourable the Attorney-General—the correspondence is shown in Appendix F.

Query, 23rd May, 1895.—With reference to the expenditure of £1101 4s. 7d. upon Telegraph Cable and Telegraph Stores, also the cost of the erection of the new Registry of Deeds Office being charged to the vote under Act 57 Vict. No. 42 for "Additions Public Buildings—to provide accommodation for Post and Telegraph Offices." The Hon. the Treasurer considered the items queried were properly chargeable to the vote referred to.

Auditor-General's Salary.—It is very much regretted that it should be necessary to bring under the notice of Parliament a question of a personal nature at the very outset of the Auditor-General's first year of office, but from the correspondence which is submitted at the end of this Report it will be seen that the matter of the salary of the Auditor-General has been dealt with by the Auditor in his official capacity quite apart from the fact that he was the individual concerned. With reference to the Honourable the Treasurer's memorandum of the 7th February last, in which it is remarked that a very special and separate agreement was made, the Auditor-General thought it was simply his duty to see the provisions of the Act 58 Vict. No. 22 carried out, and it was considered that these were given effect to by the issue of the Governor-in-Council's Minute of 31st December last, granting as it did the £500 voted, without qualification. The salary at the lower rate of £404 was passed upon receipt of the opinion of the Honourable the Attorney-General of date 15th February last, subject to the decision of Parliament, and for this decision the question is respectfully submitted.—(See Appendix G.)

The ordinary staff of the Audit Department, while reduced in numbers, has undertaken extra work in connection with examination of Income Tax Accounts, Corporation Accounts, and in other ways, and it is only by dint of much overtime auditing that the office work is kept from falling into arrear. In this, my first year of office as Auditor-General, I have much pleasure in testifying to the loyal and cheerful manner in which the whole of the staff are carrying out their duties.

Opinion.

The Auditor-General is the servant of Parliament, and would be acting illegally if he consented to any reduction being made in his salary contrary to the knowledge and intention of Parliament. But in the matter of his salary for the current year Ministers announced to Parliament the arrangement they had made with him, and the House of Assembly passed a Bill fixing his salary at the sum agreed upon by him and Ministers. When the Bill reached the Legislative Council exception was taken to the insertion of any sum less than £500 as the nominal salary attached to the office, and the sum of £500 was inserted. But I am instructed that the Member who moved the insertion of the sum of £500 stated that the adoption of his amendment by the Council need not interfere with any arrangement made between Ministers and the Auditor-General in regard to his salary for the following year, and upon that understanding the amendment was carried in the Council, and was agreed to by the House of Assembly. In view of these facts I am of opinion that the Auditor-General will not be acting in any way contrary to the knowledge or wish of Parliament in authorising the payment to himself of the lesser sum agreed upon by himself and Ministers. It will be his duty to place this correspondence and opinion before Parliament in connection with his annual Report, and if either of the Houses of Parliament is dissatisfied with what has been done, the arrears of the larger salary can then be paid to him.
