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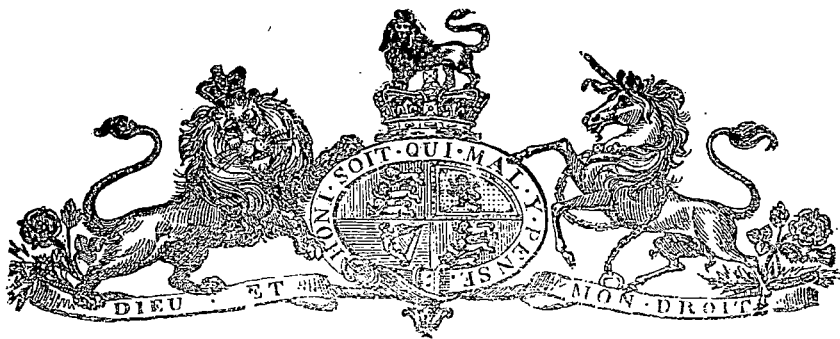

Hobart, 18th February, 1891.

SIR,

THE Ladies' Committee, in presenting their Tenth Annual Report, are glad to say the work of the Institution has gone on steadily throughout the year.

At the beginning of the year there were sixteen girls; four were received during the year, and four left the Institution. Their behaviour on the whole has been good.

Every Sunday morning a short service is held in the Institution, and classes by ladies for Bible instruction.

During this year great improvements have been made in building a large dining hall, new bath-rooms, and four more bedrooms, also a verandah. The plans for the building were prepared and carried out under the supervision of G. Fagg, Esq., who generously gave the cost of his services, £9 15s. 9d., as a donation to the Institution. The cost of the work was £193 16s.

The girls are employed in washing, housework, cooking, and needlework; receive instruction in reading, writing, and arithmetic.

The amount received for washing during the year was £286 6s. 3d.

The Committee again record their appreciation of the energy and zeal of the Matrons, which help so much towards the success of the Institution.
