

To the Honorable the Legislative Assembly of Tasmania, in Parliament assembled.

Your Petitioners beg to inform your Honorable House that, according to the local papers, the Victorian Government have made, or are about to make, a similar concession to Photographers, on condition of their paying an Annual Fee of Five Shillings,—a Fee which your Petitioners are willing to pay.
